

India and U.S. in talks for Stryker infantry vehicles

Deals for MQ-9B unmanned aerial vehicles and GE-414 jet engines are making progress along with defence industrial collaborations under the initiative on Critical and Emerging Technology

ndia has expressed interest in co-producing the Stryker infantry vehicles and it is in "relatively" early stages of talks with the U.S. on the Stryker and the Javelin anti-tank guided missiles (ATGM), says the U.S. Deputy Secretary of State Kurt M. Campbell.

At the same time, deals for MQ-9B unmanned aerial vehicles and GE-414 jet engines are making progress along with defence industrial collaborations under the initiative on Critical and Emerging Technology (iCET) framework.

Discussions on Stryker have been going on for several months now, and officials said the deal could potentially see local manufacture of several hundred variants of the vehicle under licence with some customisations for the Indian Army, including one with Javelin mounted on them.

However, several defence officials expressed

Early stages

"India has expressed an interest in the co-production of Stryker, and I think we're still in relatively early stages and the U.S. Army plans to demonstrate the capabilities of the Stryker to the Indian Army at an early opportunity," Mr. Campbell stated.

"We've had some discussions around the coproduction of Javelin and Stryker. We're exploring a number of avenues for both co-production and engagement around technological areas where we could collaborate together on development more generally in R&D."

Mr. Campbell was speaking in a virtual briefing on Wednesday on the second India-U.S. iCET dialogue that was chaired by the two National Security Advisers last week. The U.S. has in the past demonstrated both Stryker as well as Javelin for the Indian Army during bilateral exercises. Javelin was extensively evaluated by the Indian Army, though the deal did not go through.

On the MQ-9B deal, Mr. Campbell noted that the letter of offer and acceptance was delivered to India in early March, and they are awaiting signature to move forward.

"General Atomics is negotiating details of the sale with the Ministry of Defence and we are prepared, obviously, to work with them in addressing any outstanding questions," he stated.

The deal is in advanced stages and expected to go for approval by the Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS) in the next few months. Similarly, the deal for licence manufacture of the GE-414 engines by Hindustan Aeronautics Ltd. (HAL) to power the Light Combat Aircraft (LCA)-Mk1A is also in advanced stages.

TN to get new international airport in Hosur town

CHENNAI, JUNE 27

TAMIL NADU Chief Minister M K Stalin announced a new international airport in Hosur — an industrial border town hardly 40 kms away from Bangalore. The announcement, made under Rule 110 in the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly on Thursday, is to build an airport in 2,000 acres of land and is designed to handle 30 million passengers annually.

'LARGER ACADEMIC INTEREST': BEHIND BOMBAY HC'S HIJAB BAN DECISION

THE BOMBAY High Court on Wednesday dismissed a plea by nine students of Chembur's N G Acharya & D K Marathe College challenging the institute's dress code banning hijab, and held that the decision was "in larger academic interest".

It relied on and expressed "full agreement" with the 2022 judgment of the full Bench of the Karnataka High Court that had validated the state government's hijab ban in government colleges,

Contention on the dress code

The Chembur college issued a new dress code in May this year, which would be implemented in the academic year beginning June. This followed controversy last August, when several junior college girls wearing hijab were denied entry for alleged non-compliance with the prescribed uniform.

The new dress code stated that burqa, niqab, hijab, or any religious identifiers such as badges, caps, or stoles will not be permitted inside the college. The dress code prescribed half- and full-sleeved shirts with trousers for boys, and "any Indian/ western non-revealing dress" for girls.

Nine aggrieved women students approached the HC, terming the college's instructions "arbitrary and discriminatory".

Bombay HC judgment

A division Bench of Justices Atul S Chandurkar and Rajesh S Patil held that the dress code issued by the college was in "larger academic interest", and "[did] not suffer from infirmity so as to violate provisions of Article 19(1)(a) and Article 25 of the Constitution". "The object behind issuing the same is that the dress of a student should not reveal his/ her religion, which is a step towards ensuring that the students focus on gaining knowledge and education which is in their larger interest," the Bench stated.

The Bench also rejected the argument that the "donning of a hijab or niqab is an essential religious practice of petitioners", saying that except for the English translations of Kanz-ul-Iman and Saman Abu Dawud, there was no material placed to support the claim.

The Bench held that since the instructions issued were "applicable to all students irrespective of their caste, creed, religion or language", they did not violate UGC guidelines. It added that a student attending an institution to advance their academic career cannot seek to impose her rights against the 'larger rights' of the college in maintaining discipline on its premises.

Order of the Karnataka HC

Justice Chandurkar, who authored the judgment, expressed "full agreement" with the view taken by the full Bench of the Karnataka High Court in 2022, which stated that the "prescription of a dress code is intended to achieve uniformity amongst students...so as to maintain discipline and avoid disclosure of one's religion".

The HC had held that "the dress code when prescribed for all students was intended to treat them as one homogeneous class so as to serve constitutional secularism".

This verdict is under challenge at the Supreme Court. In October 2022, a twojudge Bench delivered a split verdict, and the case has now been referred to a larger Bench. The Bombay HC verdict too is likely to be contested before the SC.

SpaceX gets \$843-mn deal to help discard ISS

NASA AWARDED SPACEX \$843 million to build a vehicle capable of pushing the International Space Station (ISS) into Earth's atmosphere for its planned destruction around 2030, it said on Wednesday, a task originally meant for Russia's thrusters.

Under its new NASA contract, SpaceX will build what the space agency called the US Deorbit Vehicle to deorbit the space station and avoid risks to populated areas, with NASA taking ownership of the craft and handling deorbiting operation.

The football field-sized research lab, led primarily by the United States and Russia, has been continuously staffed with government astronauts during its some 24 years of operation, but its aging components have led NASA and its foreign partners to set 2030 as a planned retirement date.

The US, Japan, Canada and the countries under the European Space Agency have committed to the space station partnership through 2030, while Russia has agreed to remain a partner through 2028, the date through which the Russian space agency Roscosmos believes its hardware can last.

Output growth in India's eight core infrastructure sectors eased to 6.3% in May, from April's 6.7% pace, with a double-digit rise in coal and electricity production offsetting contractions in three sectors, including cement and fertilizers.

Sequentially, the Index of Core Industries (ICI) rose 3.7% from April's levels.

Electricity generation rose year-on-year at a seven-month high pace of 12.8%, while coal production grew 10.2%.

The CSIR UGC-NET, which was postponed as a preemptive measure, will be conducted from July 25 to July 27.

The National Common Entrance Test (NCET) for admission to the four-year Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) in select Central and State Universities or institutions, including the IITs, the NITs, the RIEs, and government colleges, which was postponed hours before its schedule on June 12, is now planned for July 10.

AHEAD OF the Assembly elections later this year, the Maharashtra Government announced a slew of populist measure in its Budget on Friday — from monthly allowances for women to stipends for unemployed youth; tuition fees for girls from OBC and EWS households to benefits for farmers; three free LPG cylinders per year for eligible families to tax cuts on fuel in Mumbai Metropolitan Region (MMR).

In February, Deputy Chief Minister and State Finance Minister Ajit Pawar had presented an interim budget for 2024-25 in view of the Lok

Yojana. The estimated annual expenditure for the scheme is Rs 46,000 crore.

The government also proposed to offer three free LPG cylinders to some households annually under the 'Mukhya The scheme, expected to benefit about 2.05 lakh girls, will start from the 2024-25 academic year and cost the state exchequer about Rs 2,000 crore annually.

For the unemployed youth, the government announced a skill


analysts. Foreign investors have already poured more than \$11 billion into index-eligible bonds since the inclusion decision was announced in September last year.

"Foreign holdings of India bonds have been on the lower side till now and hence the index inclusion event could be a watershed moment for sovereign markets," Aditya Bagree, head markets, Citi - India & Indian Subcontinent, told FE. "This development coupled with the strong macrooutlook for the country has bought



Honours to India's Hansa Mehta



- Recently, the President of the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA)
 honoured Hansa Mehta on the International Day for Women in Diplomacy
 (24 June).
- This day honors and acknowledges the contributions and accomplishments of women in the realm of diplomacy.

- Hansa Mehta:
- She was a prominent Indian scholar, educator, social reformer, writer and diplomat from India.
- She was born on 3rd July 1897 and was a champion of women's rights.
- Mehta played a pivotal role in revising the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR) to include gender-inclusive language.
- हंसा मेहता:
- वह भारत की एक प्रमुख भारतीय विद्वान, शिक्षिका, समाज सुधारक, लेखिका और राजनियक थीं।
- उनका जन्म 3 जुलाई 1897 को हुआ था और वह महिला अधिकारों की समर्थक थीं।
- मेहता ने लिंग-समावेशी भाषा को शामिल करने के लिए मानव अधिकारों की सार्वभौमिक घोषणा (यूडीएचआर) को संशोधित करने में महत्वपूर्ण भूमिका निभाई।

- She successfully changed the phrase, "All men are born free and equal," to "All human beings are born free and equal" in Article 1 of the UDHR.
- As the President of All India Women's Conference (AIWC) in 1946, she led the drafting of the "Indian Women's Charter of Rights", which demanded gender equality, civil rights and justice for women in India.

Ladakh Achieves Full Functional Literacy

- Recently the Union Territory (UT) of Ladakh has been declared to achieve Full Functional Literacy under the ULLAS-Nav Bharat Saksharta Karyakram after having achieved over 97% literacy.
- Functional literacy refers to a person's ability to effectively engage in activities that require reading, writing and calculation for personal and community development.

About GI Tag

 A Geographical Indication (GI) is a label used on products that come from a specific place, highlighting qualities or reputation linked to that location. Internationally, GI is recognized as part of Intellectual Property Rights (IPRs) under agreements like the WTO's TRIPS Agreement, Paris Convention, Madrid Agreement, and Lisbon Agreement.

 - The French President has been directly elected by popular vote, while the Prime Minister is the leader of the largest party/coalition in the National Assembly.
