

Study Data and Scope

1.Health Effects of Short-term Exposure

The Centre has extended the Smart Cities Mission (SCM) under the Union Urban Development Ministry till March 31, 2025.

Under the SCM, launched in June 2015, 100 cities were chosen through a competition to be developed as smart cities. The mission envisions developing areas within selected cities in the country as model areas based on an area development plan, which is expected to have a ruboff effect on other parts of the city and nearby cities and towns.

More than 8,000 multisectoral projects are being developed by the 100 cities amounting to around ₹1.6 lakh crore under the SCM. As on July 3, the 100 cities have completed 7,188 projects (90% of total pro-

jects) amounting to ₹1,44,237 crore as part of the mission.

The balance 830 projects amounting to ₹19,926 crore are also in advanced stages of completion, an official statement said on Wednesday.

We want to be part of planetary defence mission, study asteroid: ISRO Chairman

EXPRESS NEWS SERVICE BENGALURU, JULY 3

ISRO IS keen on participating in a planetary defence mission in space and study the asteroid Apophis when it comes close to the Earth, ISRO Chairman S Somanath said in Bengaluru on Wednesday.

"When Apophis comes in 2029, we should be able to go and meet this asteroid when it is very close to Earth. It is a onetime opportunity and India should be part of such efforts. It is yet to be decided in what way we should participate," Somanath said.

Discovered in 2004, Apophis was seen as a potential contender to have a collision with the Earth. But subsequent measurements have shown that there was no risk of Apophis impacting the Earth for at least a century, according to NASA. In 2029, however, it would make a fly-by of the Earth at a distance of about 32,000 km. NASA has redirected one of its operational spacecraft to study this asteroid, and this spacecraft would

get as near to Apophis as 4,000 km on April 23, 2029. It will therefore, keep following the asteroid for 18 months to map its terrain and understand its chemical make-up.

ISRO is looking at working in some capacity to study the asteroid Apophis when it is 32,000 km away from Earth in 2029 to prepare for planetary defence efforts, ISRO scientists said.

"We must provide whatever support we can in the asteroid mission to participate and learn. We are eager to spread our knowledge," Somanath said.

Referring to NASA's Double

Asteroid Redirection Test (DART) mission in 2022, which facilitated the change of trajectory of an asteroid in deep space, he said, "When there is information that an asteroid will strike Earth in a couple of years, there will be a demand to act. It would be better if we act when there is no threat. This is why there are many missions to go near asteroids and understand them. One of them is DART."

"It is a mission to show it is possible to change the asteroid trajectory a little and cause it to depart from its course. If we can change the trajectory, it will miss Earth by a whisker. That will be good enough to save Earth," he said.

DART showed that a spacecraft's kinetic impact with its target asteroid, Dimorphos, had successfully altered its orbit. "This marks humanity's first time purposely changing the motion of a celestial object and the first full-scale demonstration of asteroid deflection technology," NASA had stated in 2022.

As a major space-faring nation with the capability "to carry out complex missions of taking a spacecraft from one place to another", Somanath said India "will one day be in a position to handle an asteroid mission, land on an asteroid and possibly carry out a planetary defense action to protect Earth".

"We should start by collaborating with other nations that have already started work in this area. For example, there is Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency (JAXA), which has gone to an asteroid and collected samples. There are also many other agencies." he said.

Associate director of ISRO's Telemetry, Tracking and Command Centre (ISTRAC), Anil Kumar A K said, "In 2004, our observatories were able to see an object 340 meters in size was coming close. Our people calculated with the available data that the threat of this object coming and impacting Earth is more than one in 100 probability which is a high risk."

"The object is known as Apophis and its sphere is 360 days which is almost one Earth year and as a result it can be seen often in the vicinity of Earth," he said.

ISRO's Interest in Planetary Defence

Participation in Planetary Defence Mission

- ISRO aims to study asteroid Apophis as part of a planetary defence mission.
- Chairman S Somanath highlighted this interest during a talk in Bengaluru.
- Apophis will come close to Earth in 2029, presenting a unique opportunity.

- Details on Apophis
- Discovered in 2004, initially considered a collision threat to Earth.
- Later measurements showed no risk for at least a century.
- Will make a close fly-by at a distance of 32,000 km from Earth in 2029.

NASA's Role and DART Mission

- NASA redirected a spacecraft to study Apophis and understand its makeup.
- DART mission in 2022 successfully demonstrated asteroid deflection by altering the trajectory of Dimorphos.
- DART's success is humanity's first step in changing the motion of a celestial object for planetary defence.



• ISRO's Preparation and Collaboration

- ISRO plans to get as close as 4,000 km to Apophis on April 23, 2029.
- Will study the asteroid for 18 months to understand its terrain and makeup.
- Collaboration with international space agencies, like JAXA, for planetary defence is emphasized.



- Technological and Observational Capabilities
- ISRO's Telemetry, Tracking, and Command Centre (ISTRAC) and other observatories can track objects up to 340 meters in size.
- Calculation of Apophis's impact threat shows it has a higher than 1 in 100 probability, indicating significant risk.

- 1. India's goal to be a major space-faring nation with the capability to handle asteroid missions and potentially protect Earth.
- 2. Importance of international collaboration and technological advancement in planetary defence.

FASTEST-EVER 10,000-POINT RALLY

SENSEX TOPS 80,000

Closes just shy of the historic mark; banks drive gains


THE RECORD-BREAKING rally of equities crossed a fresh milestone on Wednesday as Sensex touched the 80,000-point mark for the first time. With this, the benchmark index of 30 stocks has registered its fastest-ever 10,000-point rally, rising from 70,000 to 80,000 in just 136 trading sessions.

In comparison, the benchmark index took nearly 1,000 days on average for each of its previous five 10,000-point rallies.

On Wednesday, Sensex rose 545.34 points or 0.7% to close at 79,986.80, after hitting a record high of 80,074.30 intra-day. The Nifty index also ended with gains of 0.7% or 162.65 points at 24,286.50 points.

Mahindra & Mahindra, Power Grid Corp, Bharti Airtel and State Bank of India (SBI) are the biggest Sensex gainers in the index's journey from 70,000 to 80,000 points.

In the last seven trading sessions, Sensex has hit three mile-



stones — 78,000, 79,000 and 80,000 points.

Nilesh Shah, managing director at Kotak Mahindra AMC, said this is a journey, not a destination. "Early in June, when the election outcome came, quite a few investors expected volatility in the market. But it has not panned out that way. The flows have been quite strong," said Janakiraman R, chief investment officer emerging markets equity - India, Franklin Templeton.

As per the provisional data, for-

eign portfolio investors (FPIs) bought ₹5,483.63 crore worth of shares on Wednesday, while domestic institutional investors sold ₹924.43-crore shares.

Havaldar Adbul Hamid

- Recently, the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) chief visited the village Dhamupur in Ghazipur, Uttar Pradesh, the native village of 1965 war hero Abdul Hamid.
- He released two books- 'Mere Papa Paramvir' on Hamid and 'Bharat ka Musalman'.
- Abdul Hamid was a soldier in the 4th Grenadiers in the Indian Army who fought and died during the Battle of Asal Uttar in the 1965 India-Pakistan war.

- Asal Uttar is situated in Punjab near the India-Pakistan border.
- The **Battle of Asal Uttar** was one of the **largest tank battles** fought during the 1965 war, where the Pakistani 1 Armoured Division's offensive was decimated by the Indian forces.
- The battle resulted in the loss of 97 Patton tanks for the Pakistani Army, and the surrender of an entire Pakistani armoured regiment.


Hamid was deployed near Chima village. On 10th September 1965, he destroyed 3 Pakistani tanks and disabled a 4th one but was **killed in the process.**

Hamid was awarded the **Param Vir Chakra**, India's highest gallantry award, posthumously for his bravery.

The site of his death is now part of a **war memorial**, with a captured Pakistani Patton tank standing as a tribute.

Rudram-1



- India successfully test-fires new generation anti-radiation missile 'Rudram-1'
- About Rudram-1
- It is the first indigenous antiradiation missile developed by the DRDO for the Indian Air Force (IAF).



- Key Features:
 - Launch Platform: Sukhoi-30MKI fighter jets
 - Guidance System: Inertial
 Navigation Systems (INS)-GPS
 navigation and Passive
 Homing Head for final attack
 - Range: 100-250 km
 - Speed: Up to Mach 2 (twice the speed of sound)



- Significance
- Enhances IAF's Suppression of Enemy Air Defence (SEAD)
 Capability: Rudram-1 allows the IAF to conduct SEAD operations deep within enemy territory, neutralizing critical air defense installations and paving the way for other aircraft to operate safely.
- Force Multiplier: The missile acts as a force multiplier by enhancing the survivability and effectiveness of air operations.
- Indigenous Development: Its indigenous development is a significant step towards self-reliance in defense technology.

WHO's Polio Eradication Missing Deadline

- The WHO's Global Polio Eradication Initiative is set to miss its deadline of eradicating polio by the end of 2024.
- About
- Polio eradication is one of the top priorities of the World Health Organisation (WHO).
- Of the 3 strains of wild poliovirus (type 1, type 2 and type 3), wild poliovirus type 2 was eradicated in 1999 and wild poliovirus type 3 was eradicated in 2020.
 - Endemic wild poliovirus type 1 remains in two countries: Pakistan and Afghanistan.

- But according to a recent report in Science, the virus is beginning to reappear in big cities in these two countries.
 - This reemergence is a result of vaccine hesitancy due to misinformation, conflict, poverty, and limited access to these isolated regions.



- Polio
- Poliomyelitis (polio) is a highly infectious viral disease that largely affects children under 5 years of age.
- The virus is transmitted by person-to-person spread mainly through the faecaloral route or, less frequently, by a common vehicle (e.g. contaminated water or food) and multiplies in the intestine, from where it can invade the nervous system and cause paralysis.

- Vaccination: There is no cure for polio, it can only be prevented.
 - Polio vaccine, given multiple times, can protect a child for life.
 - There are two vaccines available: oral polio vaccine and inactivated polio vaccine. Both are effective and safe.

Minami-Torishima island (Japan)

- Researchers discovered 230 million tons of minerals, including cobalt and nickel, off a remote island 1,200 miles from Tokyo.
- This find could supply <u>Japan's EV battery needs for over a decade</u>. The seabed near Minami-Torishima island contains 610,000 metric tons of cobalt <u>and 740,000 metric tons</u> of nickel.
- Mining is set to begin in 2025, with commercial extraction expected by 2026.
- The discovery is significant as global demand for these minerals is projected to rise sharply, though deep-sea mining poses technical and environmental challenges.

Minami-Torishima Island, also known as Marcus Island, is an isolated Japanese coral atoll in the northwestern Pacific Ocean, 1,950 km southeast of Tokyo.



It is Japan's easternmost territory and the only one on the Pacific Plate. The island is shaped like an equilateral triangle and formed by a raised coral reef, with flat terrain and a maximum altitude of 9 meters.






