
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



28,458 Indians died abroad in the past three years, says MEA in reply to RTI query


A total of 28,458 Indians died abroad in the past three years, a Right to Information (RTI) reply given by the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) states.


It said 24,278 Indians died of natural causes, 1,622 in accidents, 686 due to occupational hazards, 1,736 from suicide, and 136 from violence and murder.

"Some of which [deaths] pertain to Indian students," Praveen Kumar Munjal, Chief Public Information Officer, MEA has stated, replying to an RTI filed by activist Dr. Vivek Pandey.

The Diaspora Engagement Division of the MEA said that most of the deaths of Indians residing abroad were caused by natural causes. Some deaths were reported due to traffic accidents, occupational hazards, violence, and suicides.

While the RTI asks for details of total number of Indian students who died abroad in last five years till date, as well as country and year wise details of the deaths, they have not been provided.

Also the details on amount of money spent by the Indian government to bring back students who are in any kind of medical emergency in last five years was not provided.

In 2024, eleven Indian and Indian-origin students died due to shooting, kidnappings, suicides and so on. In January earlier this year, Vivek Saini, 25, an Indian student was killed in Georgia.

Mr. Saini was a Master's student and working at a convenience store in West Georgia. A drug addict attacked him with a hammer up to fifty times. Two Indian students around the same time were found dead, reportedly due to Fentanyl overdose in their Connecticut home.

Take urgent action

"I urge the government to take immediate action to protect our citizens abroad. We need to establish robust support systems, including mental health resources, emergency assistance and better co-ordination with foreign governments. The MEA must prioritise safety and well-being of Indians abroad by enhancing consular services, increasing awareness about local laws and safety protocols, and providing timely assistance in emergencies," Dr. Pandey told The Hindu.



While the Gandhi Sagar sanctuary in Madhya Pradesh is the preferred location for the next lot of imports, Banni in Gujarat is also getting readied to house some of the big cats to land in India

ome of the next batch of cheetahs being brought in from Africa, as part of the next phase of Project Cheetah, may be sent to a cheetah-breeding and conservation centre being built in the sprawling grasslands of Banni in the Rann of Kutch in Gujarat, senior officials in the Environment Ministry told *The Hindu*.

While the Gandhi Sagar sanctuary in Madhya Pradesh is the preferred location for the next lot of wild cats, with Banni being considered a potential habitat for over a decade, officials say there is a surge in activity to set up basic infrastructure in Banni and get it ready this year.

"The next [lot of] animals will go to Gandhi Sagar. However, the Gujarat government is setting up suitable enclosures in Banni where cheetahs can be bred. If all goes to plan, there is no reason (the site) cannot be readied in the next six months and some animals sent there," an official told *The Hindu*.

Banni is a vast grassland in the southern part of Kutch and extends to near-

ly 3,500 square kilometres. While that is plenty of space, more than that available in Kuno and Gandhi Sagar, there is barely enough prey to sustain a viable population. Antelope species such

"It will take years for enough prey, and practically this means chital – the main prey for the cheetahs in India – needs to be brought into these grasslands. There isn't an official plan yet but it is a site that is under consideration," the official added.

While the Madhya Pradesh Forest Department is tasked with managing the cheetahs at Kuno in Madhya Pradesh, an expert steering committee gives scientific input on managing the programme. This includes recommending future sites for introducing fresh batches of cheetahs at regular intervals.

Of the 20 adult cheetahs brought to Kuno since September 2022, 13 survive. Additionally there are 13 cubs, making it 26 animals overall. However, the maximum capacity (in terms of available prey) of the Kuno reserve is for 21 adult animals.

The government's estimate is that India will need to import anywhere between 10 and 12 adult cheetahs every year for the next five years to groom a sustainable breeding population. "One attractive aspect of Banni is that there are no leopards. So with enough prey, we can overtime sustain a larger population. But this is a longterm plan," an official said.

In October, all of the cheetahs in Kuno are expected to be released into the wild. Currently, most of them are in the bomas, or large enclosures that are a kilometre wide and long. These animals were brought in after infections and acclimatisation problems led to fatalities. Following the release of all the animals into the wild, preparations for the next batch are expected to begin – again from South Africa and Namibia.



India successfully flight-tests Ph-II ballistic missile defence system

New Delhi: India successfully flight-tested the second phase of its ballistic missile defence system Wednesday. The target missile was launched at 4.20pm mimicking an adversary ballistic missile from launching complex IV at Abdul Kalam island off coast of Odisha.

It was detected by the weapon system radar and the AD interceptor system was activated, according to a government statement.


The interceptor AD endo-atmospheric missile was launched at 4.24 pm from launching complex III at Chandipur. The flight test fully met all the trial objectives validating a complete network-centric warfare weapon system consisting of long range sensors, low latency communication system, and MCC and Advance Interceptor missiles, the statement said.

SINGAPORE, WHICH SUBSISTS ON IMPORTED FOOD, IS LOOKING TO SECURE ITS FUTURE WITH NEW WAYS OF FEEDING PEOPLE In Singapore, customers can now buy meat grown in a lab

IT WAS a remarkable moment in the annals of food, perhaps even humanity: A store in Singapore started selling lab-grown meat directly to the general public in May. On a recent Saturday, visitors

to the store, Huber's Butchery, watched as a chef sautéed filets - 3% of which were generated from chicken cells and the rest from plant proteins - and served them in taco shells with avocado, pico de gallo and coriander.

It looked, cooked and tasted

like chicken. Sascha Wenninger, 39, put three packs of the meat in his shopping basket. "I like eating meat, and if I can do it without animal cruelty, it's ideal," he said. Others were not so enthused about meat cultivated in a lab. "Why eat something artificial when you can get fresh live chicken from nature?" said Philippe Ritoux, 58.

The city-state, which is smaller than New York City, has spent tens of millions of dollars to study novel ways of producing food because it has very little land to farm and imports 90% of its food. It has looked at urban





and vertical agriculture, approved insects for human consumption and given generous subsidies to cultivated meat startups. Singapore became the first country to approve a labgrown, or "cultivated meat" product for commercial sale in 2020 (the US followed two years later, but Florida banned it in May) and has since given the green light to other futuristic products including a protein-rich powder synthesised from air and a concoction that does not require animal cells to grow meat in a lab. "Before Singapore, cultivated meat was completely science fiction," said

Josh Tetrick, co-founder of Eat Just, the company behind the cultivated meat being sold at Huber's. Consequently, any success Singapore has could have global significance. But for many experts, lab-grown meat has failed to live up to its promise of replacing traditional meat and reining in climate change by reducing greenhouse gases that are emitted from livestock farming. The price tag of the quarter-


pound bags of cultivated meat at Huber's – 7.20 Singapore dollars, about \$5.30 – is a testament to how incredibly expensive it is to produce it. "There are enormous scaling challenges between where we are and where we need to get to, and those scaling challenges are not guaranteed to be solved." Tetrick said. Partly because of this, new funding for labgrown meat startups is drying up. Before it began retail sales, cultivated meat in Singapore was available only in the restaurant within Huber's. Starting in January 2023, Huber's sold a sandwich with fries and greens and a pasta dish with spring vegetable orecchiette. Both dishes were priced at 18.50 Singapore dollars and heavily subsidized by Eat Just's subsidiary. Good Meat. NYT

Lal Dora-Free Haryana

- All villages of Haryana have been made Lal Dora-free.

The Finance Ministry has allocated Rs 500 crore for the Namo Drone Didi scheme and Rs 365.64 crore for National Mission on Natural Farming for 2024-25.

Namo Drone Didi scheme

• It is an initiative aimed at providing drones to **15,000** selected women self-help groups (SHGs) during the period 2023-24 to 2025-2026 for providing rental services to farmers.

• The women beneficiaries are trained to become drone pilots under the initiative.

• How will Drone Didis help farmers?

- The trained women drone pilots will help farmers in various agricultural operations like fertilizer spraying, sowing seeds and crop monitoring.
- The initiative intends to modernize Indian agricultural practices and enhance productivity by placing the cutting edge technology at the disposal of rural women.
- The Centre will provide each SHG identified a **subsidy up to 80 per cent** towards the cost of a drone or a maximum of Rs 8 lakh.

- Researchers are planning human clinical trials following promising results.

Importance

The study's findings may lead to a breakthrough in snakebite treatment, especially in regions with high snakebite morbidity.

Tinzaparin, a widely available and inexpensive drug, could revolutionize snakebite treatment.

World's Forests 2024 Report



The theme for this year is "<u>Accelerating forest solutions through</u> <u>innovation</u>."



Key highlights include a decrease in the deforestation rate to <u>10.2 million</u> <u>hectares per year</u> in 2015-2020 from <u>15.8 million hectares</u> per year in 1990-2000, with <u>India ranking 3rd</u> for average annual net gain in forest area from 2010-2020. Non-timber forest products support the livelihoods of about 275 million people in India.

There is a **pressing need for innovation in the forest sector to address climate change stress** through resilient forest and land management strategies against wildfires and pests.

Innovations Enhancing Forest Potential:

Technological: Remote sensing and cloud computing improve forest management by generating high-quality data (e.g., NASA and ESA's Landsat and Copernicus programs).

<u>Social, Policy, and Institutional</u>: Engaging women, youth, and Indigenous People through dynamic innovations (e.g., <u>India's Joint Forest Management Programme mandates 1/3rd</u> <u>female representation</u> on committees).

Financial: Innovations to enhance the value of standing forests and boost restoration efforts (e.g., **SCRIPT – Soft Commodity Risk Platform**).


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
