



As many as 47 people are still missing in Shimla, Mandi and Kullu districts, after heavy rain left rivers in spate. Fifty-five people have been evacuated so far, while 27 are stranded

he Supreme Court on Friday pronounced a scathing iudgment calling out the "flip-flops" of the National Testing Agency (NTA) in the conduct of the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test, 2024 for admission to undergraduate medical courses and put the government on a deadline to completely restructure the exam process.

"The manner in which NTA organised the exam this year gives rise to serious concerns... NTA has sufficient resources at its disposal. It has adequate funding, time, and opportunities to organise exams such as the NEET without lapses of the kind that occurred this year," Chief Justice of India D.Y. Chandrachud, who authored the verdict, criticised the agency.

The three-judge Bench, headed by the Chief Jus-

tice, directed the Centre, acting through its high-powered committee headed by former Indian Space Research Organisation Chairperson K. Radhakrishnan, to recommend and implement top-to-bottom overhauling of the test process, including rectifying "serious security lapses", introduce data protection measures, periodic audits, surprise inspections of test centres, grievance redress mechanisms for students and foolproof logistics while specifically highlighting how question papers were transported in e-rickshaws for the May 5 test.

Plan of action

The court directed the Radhakrishnan committee to submit its report to the Education Ministry by September 30. The Ministry has to take a decision on the committee's recommendations within a month thereafter and implement the plan of action.

Hoarding collapses in Thane; 2 injured, 3 vehicles damaged

A hoarding collapsed on Friday morning at Kalyan in Maharashtra's Thane, injuring two persons and damaging three vehicles. Kalyan Tehsildar Sachin Shejal confirmed that heavy rain with gusty winds were the cause for the collapse that happened around 10.15 a.m. at Sahajanand Chowk. "We will initiate action against the erring contractor for failing to adhere to the guidelines laid out for billboards and ardines " Kalvan-Dombiyli Municinal hoardings," Kaiyan-Dombvil Municipal Corporation Commissioner Indurani Jakhad said. This has happened in just a few months after the hoarding collapse in Ghatkopar on May 13, claiming 17 lives and injuring over 80 individuals.

Plea in SC on blood donation by transgender persons

The Supreme Court on Friday issued a formal notice to the Union government in a petition challenging the exclusion of gay persons, transgender persons, and women sex workers from donating blood. A three-judge Bench also sought responses from the National AIDS Control Organisation and the National Blood Transfusion Council. The petition has questioned the validity of Clause 12 of the 'Guidelines for Blood Donor Selection & Blood Donor Referral, 2017' issued by the National Blood Transfusion Council and the National AIDS Control Organisation.

India selects 2 crew members for Axiom-4 mission to ISS

Shubhanshu Shukla and Prasanth Balakrishnan Nair, Group Captains in the IAF, will train in U.S.; experience gained during the mission will be beneficial for human space programme, says ISRO

ndian astronaut-designates Group Captain Shubhanshu Shukla and Group Captain Prasanth Balakrishnan Nair have been shortlisted to go to the U.S. to train for the Axiom-4 mission to the International Space Station (ISS).

The National Mission Assignment Board has recommended them as prime and back-up mission pilots for the mission. Group Captain Shukla will be the prime mission pilot and Group Captain Nair will be the back-up.

The Axiom-4 mission is the fourth private astronaut mission to the International Space Station.

The India-U.S. joint statement during the state visit of Prime Minister Narendra Modi to the U.S. in June 2023 envisioned a joint ISRO-NASA effort to the ISS.

Towards the goal of mounting a joint ISRO-NA-SA effort, the Human Space Flight Centre (HSFC) of the ISRO has entered into a Space Flight Agree-

ment with the NASA-identified service provider Axiom Space Inc., U.S., for its upcoming Axiom-4 mission to the ISS, the ISRO said.

Scientific research

The agency added that the assigned crew members will be finally approved to fly to the International Space Station by the Multilateral Crew Operations Panel. They will commence training for the mission from the first week of August, it said.

"During the mission,

the Gaganyatri will undertake selected scientific research and technology demonstration experiments on board the ISS as well as engage in space outreach activities. The experiences gained during this mission will be beneficial for the Indian Human Space Program and it will also strengthen human space flight cooperation between ISRO and NASA," the ISRO said.

Group Captain Shukla and Group Captain Nair are among the four selected for India's Gaganyaan mission. Group Captain Shukla is an alumnus of the National Defence Academy and was commissioned on June 17, 2006 in the fighter stream of the IAF. He is a fighter combat leader and a test pilot with approximately 2,000 hours of flying experience. He has flown a variety of aircraft, including Su-30 MKI, MiG-21, MiG-29, Jaguar, Hawk, Dornier, and An-32.

Group Captain Nair is an alumnus of the NDA and recipient of the Sword of Honour at the Air Force Academy.

He was commissioned on December 19, 1998 in the fighter stream of the IAF. He is a Cat A flying instructor and a test pilot with approximately 3,000 hours of flying experience.

He has flown a variety of aircraft, including Su-30 MKI, MiG-21, MiG-29, Hawk, Dornier, and An-32. He is also an alumnus of the United States Staff College and a DS at the Defence Services Staff College, Wellington, and the Flying Instructors School, Tambaram. He has commanded a premier fighter Su-30 squadron.



"I am honored to be the presumptive Democratic nominee for President of the United States," Ms. Harris, 59, said on a phone-in to a party celebration after securing enough votes by the second day of the marathon vote. In the two

No challengers

The announcement came with Ms. Harris preparing to hit the campaign trail next week for a swing across seven crucial battleground States with her newly minted running mate – who is expected to be revealed within days.



- Recently, a ransomware attack severely disrupted the operations of at least 150-200 cooperative banks and Regional Rural Banks (RRBs) in India.
- The National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) has identified the attack, which has primarily affected banks serviced by C-Edge Technologies Ltd., a joint venture between Tata Consultancy Services Ltd. (TCS) and State Bank of India (SBI).

- How has the Ransomware Attack Affected the Banks?
- The ransomware attack targeted C-Edge Technologies Ltd., impacting their ability to provide services to cooperative banks and RRBs.
- Customers of the affected banks were unable to access payment systems, including Unified Payments Interface (UPI) and Aadhaar-enabled payment systems (AePS).
- Some RRBs, depending on their sponsor banks, continued to function normally as they use different technology service providers.

- What is Ransomware?
- Definition:
- Ransomware is a type of malware that encrypts a victim's data or locks their device, demanding a ransom for the decryption key or to regain access.
- Early Attacks: Initially, ransomware attacks focused on encrypting data and demanding a ransom for the decryption key.



Subcategories of Ransomware Include:


- Leakware or Doxware: Steals and threatens to publish sensitive data.
- Mobile Ransomware: Affects mobile devices, often using screen-lockers.
- **Wipers:** Threaten to destroy data, sometimes even if the ransom is paid.
- Scareware: Uses fear tactics to coerce payment, sometimes posing as legitimate alerts.



- Steps for Responding to a Ransomware:Isolate the infected device from the network to contain the infection. Disconnect all suspiciously behaving devices from the network to stop the spread of infection.
- Identify the entry point by checking for any alerts from any active monitoring platform and identify the ransomware by scanning encrypted files and ransom notes.
- **Prioritize the restoration of systems** by restoring the most critical ones first, followed by eradication of the threat from the network.


- Akira Ransomware
- LockBit Ransomware
- CryptoLocker: Credited with kick-starting the modern age of ransomware in 2013.
- WannaCry: A cryptoworm that attacked over 200,000 computers in 150 countries in 2017.
- Petya and NotPetya: Encrypts the file system table, rendering computers unable to boot.
- Ryuk: Popularized big-game ransomware attacks against high-value targets.
- DarkSide: Responsible for the Colonial Pipeline attack in 2021.
- Locky: Uses macros in email attachments to infect devices.
- REvil: Known for big-game hunting and double-extortion attacks.
- Conti: Operated a RaaS scheme, using double-extortion tactics.





Recently, a cloudburst, leading to flash floods in Himachal Pradesh has killed many people and several missing.

These floods caused significant destruction, including the washing away of several buildings, bridges, and roads, according to officials.



- Causes: Cloudbursts occur when strong upward currents of hot air prevent raindrops from falling, allowing them to grow larger while new smaller drops form below.
- This leads to a significant accumulation of water in the atmosphere, which is released abruptly when the upward currents weaken.

Cloudburst are Different from Rainfall:

- Rain is condensed water falling from a cloud while cloudburst is a sudden heavy rainstorm.
- Rain over 10 cm per hour is categorised as a cloudburst.
- The **cloudburst is a natural phenomenon**, but occurs quite unexpectedly, very abruptly, and rather drenching.

WHAT CAUSES CLOUDBURSTS?

Cloudbursts occur only via orographic lift i.e. a situation when a warm air parcel mixes with cooler air, resulting in sudden condensation.



Why forecasting cloudbursts is a challenge

Efforts to monitor and forecast cloudbursts are still at a nascent stage

As per the IMD definition, over 100 mm of rainfall in one hour is called a cloudburst. It usually occurs over a small geographical region (20-30 sq. km)

Rainfall of 100 mm per hour translates to 100 litres for every square metre where a cloudburst occurs. For a small region of 20 sq. km, it is about two billion litres of water in an hour

3 Tall cumulonimbus clouds causing cloudbursts can develop quickly (in about 30 minutes) as the moisture updraft happens rapidly — 60-120 km/hr




How it works?



In their experiments, the researchers successfully activated neurons in various brain regions, such as <u>the medial preoptic area (MPOA) to stimulate maternal</u> <u>behaviours in non-maternal female mice, and the lateral hypothalamus to regulate feeding behaviours</u>, significantly altering appetite and feeding patterns.
