

Being a resident of Uri, District Baramulla, he utilised his knowledge of the local terrain to establish contacts with terrorists based in PoIK. He used to assist terrorist

groups, during infiltration, by providing logistics and transportation of their illegal arms and ammunition in the interior areas of Kashmir Valley," the spokesperson said.

Teacher Nazam Din, according to the spokesperson, was "a highly motivated and committed drug peddler and an overground worker [OGW] of terrorists of Hizbul Mujahideen outfit".

Doyen of dance Yamini Krishnamurthy passes away

Renowned classical dancer Yamini Krishnamurthy passed away on Saturday after a prolonged illness. She was 83.

Her mortal remains will be kept at her dance school, Nritya Kaustubha, at Hauz Khas in Delhi on Sunday for her students and admirers to pay their last respects.

Ms. Krishnamurthy is credited with popularising Bharatanatyam in north India, as early as in the 1960s, when she chose Delhi as her home. Not content with this, she strived hard to take the dance form to the global stage, and like sitar maestro Pt. Ravi Shankar, she became a soughtafter name internationally.

Known for her vibrant approach, Ms. Krishnamurthy's dance sparkled with energy. Though she trained

The Kerala government has requested the Centre to declare the landslide that devastated at least three villages in Wayanad a national disaster. Addressing mediapersons in Thrissur on Sunday, Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan said that the destruction had few parallels in recent times in the country.

Union Minister of State for Tourism Suresh Gopi, who toured the disaster zone on Sunday, said the Centre had to adhere to several modalities and was weighing the legality of the demand.

He said the Centre had sought a report from the Kerala government. He urged the State to request the Centre to release more assistance.

Officials believe declaring the landslide a natural disaster would allow the Union government to channel more resources for rehabilitation and climate change mitigation activities, including relocation of communities living in disaster-prone zones. The Leader of the Opposition in the Kerala Assembly, V.D. Satheeshan, too demanded a national disaster tag.





- As per the Disaster Management Act, 2005, "disaster" means a catastrophe, mishap, calamity or grave occurrence in any area, arising from natural or manmade causes, or by accident or negligence which results in substantial loss of life or human suffering or damage to, and destruction of, property, or damage to, or degradation of, environment, and is of such a nature or magnitude as to be beyond the coping capacity of the community of the affected area.
 - A natural disaster includes earthquake, flood, landslide, cyclone, tsunami, urban flood.
 - A man-made disaster can be nuclear, biological and chemical.

- It can be noted that there is no provision to declare a natural calamity as a national calamity.
- The 10th Finance Commission (1995-2000) examined a proposal that a disaster be termed "a national calamity of rarest severity" if it affects one-third of the population of a state.

Disaster Management in India

The primary responsibility for management of disaster rests with the **State Government** concerned.

However, the National Policy on Disaster Management puts in place an enabling environment for all i.e. the Centre, State and District.

Sara Abraham, doyenne of Indian Art, passes away

Sara Abraham, the doyenne of contemporary Indian Art in the early 1970s, passed away in Chennai in the early hours of Sunday.

Her daughter Mariam Ram, accompanied by her husband N. Ram, was with Sara during her last hours.

Born into the distinguished family of Chalakuzhy Paulose Matthen and his wife, Eliamma Matthen, in Travancore, Kerala, as it was then known, Sara was one of eight children.

Her father, K.P. Matthen, was managing director of the Quilon Bank, which eventually became one of the largest private banks in India, the Travancore National and Quilon Bank.

Sara's father eventually moved to Madras, the financial hub of South India which was then the British

capital of the Madras Presidency.

Sara, who was then eight years old, remembered the time the family lived in a large Madras Garden house, as these were known, on the tree-lined suburb of Chetpet bordering the Cooum river.

In time, Sara and her four sisters were sent to an Anglican boarding school in Darjeeling. This is where Sara discovered art under the guidance of an inspired art teacher. That early initiation created in Sara the singular eye and instinctive ability to recognise original talent during her later years as a collector and promoter of Indian Art in its post-Independence evolution.

Later, she was a parttime student at the Government School (now College) of Arts and Crafts, Madras. K.C.S. Paniker, the principal who went on to found the Cholamandal Artists' Village, included Sara in his vibrant collegiate of artists.

In a similar way, she was able to connect with K.G. Subramanyam, or Manida, as he was to remain her mentor, when she went to Calcutta.

Journey of discovery

An early marriage to P.Z. Abraham allowed her the privilege of living in Bombay where she had perhaps the most exhilarating encounter with the young M.F. Husain. It was a time when modern Indian art and a new generation of art collectors were just beginning to recognise the explosion of creativity in the country.

It could not have been a better moment for Sara with her unique vision to be able to nurture and create what would become her journey of discovery. The Kala Yatra, as she named it, became a moveable feast of contemporary Indian Art in all its manifold variety.

The violence is the worst England has seen since the summer of 2011, when widespread rioting took place following the police killing of a mixedrace man in north London.

"We have had riots and clashes of this nature, but they have been pocketed in particular areas of the country. We are now seeing it flooding across major cities and towns," said Tiffany Lynch of the Police Federation of England and

Wales.

The government said the police have "all the resources they need" to deal with the disorder as officers warned of more demonstrations on Sunday, leading to fears the unrest could spread further again.

Forces have drafted in extra officers while Justice Minister Shabana Mahmood has insisted "the whole justice system is ready to deliver convictions as quickly as possible".

The government's Policing Minister, Diana Johnson, told BBC News the rioting would "not be tolerated", vowing "penalties and consequences" for the disorder.

Saturday's skirmishes marked the fourth day of unrest in several towns and cities following Monday's frenzied knife attack in Southport. Agitators have targeted mosques in Southport and in the northeastern English city of Sunderland, leading to hundreds of Islamic centres to bolster security amid fears for its worshippers' safety.


The rallies have been advertised on far-right social media channels under the banner "Enough is enough".

They have seen protesters waving English and British flags while chanting slogans like "Stop the boats" – a reference to irregular migrants travelling to Britain from France.

Peerless Djokovic adds a golden sheen to his career

Novak Djokovic described beating Carlos Alcaraz to claim the Olympic singles gold medal at the fifth attempt as the biggest achievement of his career on Sunday.

The 37-year-old Serb ended an eight-month trophy drought with a vintage display to win 7-6(3), 7-6(2) and complete his career Golden Slam in memorable fashion, not dropping a set in six matches at Roland Garros.

He is the oldest man to win the Olympic singles title since tennis returned to the Games in 1988 and remarkably he did it 21 days after being pummelled by Alcaraz in the Wimbledon final and two months after



- Djokovic is the fifth player to complete a career Golden Slam after Steffi Graf, Andre Agassi, Rafael Nadal and Serena Williams
- At 37, he becomes the oldest gold medallist in tennis since the sport was reintroduced in the Olympic roster in 1988
- He is the first to win the men's singles gold without dropping a set since the 1988 Seoul Games
- The Serbian's gold medal triumph comes in his maiden final appearance, adding to a bronze from 2008. He did not make the podium in 2012, 2016 and 2021

Olympics highlighted the controversy over gender identity and athletic fairness.



About the Controversy and Accusations

- Khelif found herself at the receiving end of a barrage of abuse. Many labelled her a 'biological man' who had an 'unfair advantage' over Carini. Some even mistakenly identified her as a transgender woman.
- However, fast-forward to the Paris Olympics, and both Khelif and Lin are back in the ring. It was because the sole determinant for eligibility is the gender stated in an athlete's passport.
 - Khelif's passport identifies her as female, and thus she was allowed to compete.

• Backstory

- In 2023, both Khelif and Chinese Taipei boxer Lin Yu-ting were banned from competing in the International Boxing Association's (IBA's) World Championship in New Delhi after failing a **'gender eligibility' test.**
- The specifics of this test remain confidential, but it resulted in their exclusion from the championship.
- The IBA cited that they did not meet the eligibility criteria to compete within the female category.




