

In his 11th successive address to the nation from the Red Fort, Modi seeks to do away with a 'communal civil code' and end discrimination on the basis of religion; he flags issue of women's safety, says forces of anarchy want to destabilise country

#### Mob attack fails to quell doctors' fight for justice in Bengal



Hours after a mob vandal-Hours after a mob vandal-ised their protest site at the emergency ward of the R.G. Kar Medical College and Hospital (RGKMCH) here in the early hours of Thursday, junior doctors, students and nurses continued their agitation against the rape and mur-der of a woman doctor on

Even as thousands of pe-ople in Kolkata and beyond participated in "Reclaim the Night" protests, about one hundred intoxicated persons stormed into the hospital's premises soon after midnight. They van-

after midnight. They van-dalised the protest site, stripping down posters of property, including stocks of medicines, ventilators, The Kolkata Police have arrested twelve people in connection with the mob chief Minister Mamata Ba-nerjee blamed the attack peripe blamed the attack outsiders who wish to create issues in the State', and urged the protesting dectors to roturn to work.

'Call for strong security' Junior doctors, medicos and paramedics at the RGKMCH and other hospitals across the State have been protesting for the last week, demanding justice week, demanding justice for the victim and stronger safety measures at hospi-tals. After the vandalism, the site of the agitation on the site of the agitation on Thursday and continued sloganeering. Their prot-ests intensified with the ar-rival of the newly appoint ed principal of RGKMCH,

Suhrita Pal. Nurses who mob violence surrounded Ms. Pal at the protest site on Thursday afternoon and demanded to know whether security would be strengthened at the hospi-tal. Referring to the over-night vandalism at the hos-pital premises, Ms. Pal said. "If you know anyth-

Later in the evening, the principal addressed the press and agitating doctors and assured them that se-curity had been heightcurity had been height-ened at the RGKMCH premises. "We are doing whatever is necessary to ensure safety and security," she said.

"When the mob arrived some of the police person nel swarmed into the gy nel swarmed into the gy-naecology ward and asked us if they could hide amongst us. They even re-dothes," recalled one of the protesting nurses. "They are supposed to pro-tect us, but we ended up protecting them. Higher anything to protect us."

enough parcels of land that can be pooled together and made available to a power project developer, said Saurabh Kumar, Vice President-India, Global Energy Alliance for People and Planet (GEAPP). The latter is a collaboration of the IKEA Foundation, the Rockefeller Foundation and the Bezos Earth Fund. and works on clean energy adoption and financing the transition away from fossil fuel in developing countries.

#### **Drone technology**

"We have been working with the Rajasthan government by developing a digital platform that uses drone technology to map land parcels. While this is information that is available to the government, often there is little institutional capacity to actually execute projects," said Mr. Kumar. "We connect with farmers and power developers."

"As of date, 12.3 MW has

already been installed in Rajasthan. The plan is to touch 100 MW in 2024," said Mr. Kumar. Plans are afoot to apply this approach in Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh as well, he added.

The digital platform allows tracking the scheme's progress in real-time allowing for "prompt corrective actions and provides a level of oversight crucial for the successful deployment of large-scale solar projects, where delays and mismanagement can have significant repercussions," a GEAPP document noted.

Farmers willing to set up solar modules on their

lands are paid rent by the power project developer. "GEAPP looks to ensure that landowners receive fair compensation, with lease rates linked to prevailing market rates and adjusted for inflation. GEAPP's digital solutions and on-ground support have helped mitigate these issues, enabling Rajasthan to lead in achieving its renewable energy targets," according to the document. According to the Ministry for New and Renewable Energy (MNRE), of the 256 MW installed nationallv. nearly 200 MW of solar capacity is situated in Raiasthan alone.



## Challenges:

- It provides oversight crucial for the deployment of large-scale solar projects and allows for prompt corrective actions.

## Implementation in Rajasthan:

- Rajasthan has been a significant focus for implementing the drone technology-driven platform.
- As of the current date, 12.3 MW of solar power has been installed in Rajasthan, with plans to reach 100 MW by 2024.
- The approach is also planned for Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh.

### Benefits for Farmers:

- Farmers who allow solar modules on their land are paid rent by power project developers.
- Lease rates are linked to prevailing market rates and adjusted for inflation.
- This setup helps farmers earn additional income while contributing to renewable energy targets.

## **National Impact:**

Nearly 200 MW of the 256 MW of solar capacity installed nationally under the PM-KUSUM scheme is situated in Rajasthan.

More detailed studies were under way including



# Odisha women to get one-day menstrual leave

THE ODISHA government on Thursday announced one-day menstrual leave for the working women in both private and government sectors — a decision widely hailed by rights activists and women employees.


Deputy CM Pravati Parida made the announcement during Independence Day celebrations at Cuttack. "Earlier menstrual leave was not allowed. Now, it would be optional for the working women to avail leave on the first or second day of the menstrual cycle. It will be applied for both the government and private sector employees," Parida said. The government would soon come up with detailed guidelines, sources said.

Odisha is the third state after Kerala and Bihar to bring in a menstrual leave policy.

### What is Menstruation?

- Menstruation, or period, is normal vaginal bleeding that occurs as part of a woman's monthly cycle.
- It is a normal process for girls and women who have reached puberty.
- Every month, girl or women's body prepares for pregnancy.
- If no pregnancy occurs, body gets rid of the lining in the uterus.
- The menstrual blood is partly blood and partly tissue from inside the uterus.
- The length of a period can be different for each person, but usually lasts for 3-7 days.

- Paid leaves: Menstrual leave is a Policy of allowing women to take paid leave from work or school during their menstrual period.

- What is the State of Menstrual Leaves in India?
- Menstrual (Period) Leave: It refers to leave options for working women to take paid or unpaid leave during menstruation, which can impair their ability to work.
- Implemented Policies:
  - Bihar introduced a menstrual leave policy in 1992, offering women employees two days of paid menstrual leave monthly.

- Kerala, as of 2023, grants menstrual leave to female students across universities and institutions and up to 60 days of maternity leave to female students over 18 years old.
- Corporate Initiatives: Some Indian companies have implemented menstrual leave policies, with Zomato introducing 10 days of paid period leave annually in 2020. Other companies like Swiggy, class 24 and Byjus have followed suit.

The Women's Sexual, Reproductive and Menstrual Rights Bill in 2018, have not succeeded.

### **Countries Having Implemented Menstrual Leaves:**

Spain, Japan, Indonesia, Philippines, Taiwan, South Korea, Zambia and Vietnam.

Spain is the first European country to grant paid menstrual leave to workers, with the right to three days of menstrual leave per month, which can be expanded to 5 days.

# Why latest mpox outbreak is 'emergency of international concern'

THE WORLD Health Organisation, sounding its highest level of alarm, declared mpox as a Public Health Emergency of International Concern on Wednesday. This is the second time the infection has received the designation in as many years — the outbreak between July 2022 and May 2023 was also declared as PHEIC.

The decision to sound the alarm was taken after an upsurge of cases reported from the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) and neighbour-

ing countries. At least 99,176 cases and 208 deaths due to mpox have been reported from 116 countries since 2022, according to data from the WHO.

### What is mpox?

Mpox, previously bear

muscle aches, back pain, low energy, and swollen lymph nodes, along with pox-like rashes that last for two to three weeks. It is a self-limiting disease but can lead to death, especially among children and those with weak immune systems.

While the infection has been reported in humans since 1970, it mostly affected people in the endemic regions in Africa till 2022.

Sexual transmission of clade I infections has not been reported and a second se



to humans in close proximity. Clade Ia infections that spread this way continue to affect parts of DRC where the disease was endemic.

Now, over 100 cases of clade 1b infections have been reported in four countries neighbouring DRC — Burundi, Kenya, Rwanda and Uganda — that have not reported mpox before. The numbers are likely to be higher as many with symptoms might not have been tested. This is coupled with an increase in the total number of mpox cases. More than 15,600 cases and 537 deaths have been reported so far this year alone.

"The emergence of a new clade of mpox, its rapid spread in eastern DRC, and the reporting of cases in several neighbouring countries are very worrying. On top of outbreaks of other mpox clades in DRC and other countries in Africa, it's clear that a coordinated international response is needed to stop these outbreaks and save lives," WHO Director-General Dr Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus said on Wednesday.

into several distinct lineages in the human population, where it is fast acquiring many new mutations.

### Is India at risk?

The first case of the more contagious clade Ib mpox infection outside Africa was reported from Sweden on Thursday. With interlinked global travel, the cases may reach other countries as well.

During the 2022 global outbreak, India too reported cases of mpox, albeit of the less deadly clade II type. Initially, infections were reported among some people from Kerala who had a history of international travel. But later even those without a history of international travel got infected in Delhi. At least 27 laboratory confirmed cases and one death was reported in India, according to the WHO data.

IHR Emergency Committee Chair Professor Dimie Ogoina said, "The current upsurge of mpox in parts of Africa, along with the caread of a new sexually trans-

lected there, and later caused a global outbreak in 2022. It is time to act decisively to prevent history from repeating itself."

### Are there vaccines for mpox?

There are at least two vaccines currently in use for mpox, which have been recommended by the WHO's Strategic Advisory Group of Experts on Immunization.

Last week, an Emergency Use Listing for mpox vaccines was triggered by the WHO, which will accelerate vaccine access for lower-income countries which have not yet issued their own national regulatory approval. This listing also enables bodies such as GAVI and UNICEF to procure vaccines for distribution in these countries.

WHO is working with countries and vaccine manufacturers on potential vaccine donations, and coordinating with partners through the interim Medical Countermeasures Network to facilitate equitable access to vaccines, the arganisation said

# Thaksin's daughter to be next Thailand PM

THE DAUGHTER OF former Thai leader Thaksin Shinawatra is now the favourite to become the Southeast Asian nation's next prime minister, a move that would signal continuity after another party member was ousted from the top job on Wednesday.

Paetongtarn Shinawatra, 37, received the backing of a majority of lawmakers in Thaksin's Pheu Thai party at a meeting on Thursday. The final decision will be taken by party executives, who plan to meet at 4 pm local time, senior party member Suriya Juangroongruangkit said.

Paetongtarn is the youngest of Thaksin's three children and the nominal leader of Pheu Thai, the biggest group in an 11-party coalition seeking to retain power after a court disqualified fellow Pheu Thai member Srettha Thavisin as prime minister.

Local media earlier reported that another party member, former law minister Chaikasem Nitisiri, 75, was the frontrunner to become the next premier.

The 500-member elected House of Representatives is scheduled to hold a special session on Friday to choose a new leader after Srettha was removed from office by the nation's Constitutional Court for an ethical violation.

The appointment of either Paetongtarn or Chaikasem would signal few changes to policies pursued by Srettha's administration, which focused on bolstering growth through looser fiscal policies and tackling the high cost of living and near-record household debt.

Pheu Thai, which is effectively controlled by Thaksin and his family, has secured the support of some of the nation's biggest pro-royalist conservative parties after a deal that brought the former leader back to Thailand following a prolonged exile. As long as the alliance holds, it has the support of more than 300 lawmakers in the lower house, enough to overcome any opposition.

Anutin Charnvirakul, leader of the second-biggest group Bhumjaithai Party and a top contender from the conservative camp, said his party would back any Pheu Thai nominee. "While it is still too early to tell, a new cabinet that is able to provide a good balance between coalition parties may stand to last the remainder of the four-year term and provide some medium-term political stability," according to Kaseedit Choonnawat, an analyst at Citigroup.

# Paetongtarn Shinawatra's Candidacy:
