

Bengal doctors end stir after govt. lists reforms

Resident doctors will join emergency services in State-run health facilities starting tomorrow

The movement has not stopped and campaign for safety of health workers to continue, they say

Government directives include centralised helpline number and panic alarm system

rotesting resident doctors in West Bengal on Thursday decided to call off their agitation outside Swasthya Bhawan and announced that they will join emergency services in the Staterun health facilities from Saturday.

Thousands of junior doctors have been on a strike for nearly 40 days since the body of a doctor was found inside the seminar hall of the R.G. Kar Medical College and Hospital in Kolkata.

The decision by the protesting doctors to call

off the cease-work came hours after the West Bengal government issued a list of directives for ensuring safety, security and efficient functioning of all health care professionals in the State.

According to a representative of the West Bengal Junior Doctors' Front, the doctors will take out a procession from Swasthya Bhawan, the headquarters of State Health Department, to the Central Government Officers (CGO) complex, where the office of Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) is located, on Friday.

"We have been raising the demand of safety and

security in the State-run hospitals because we did not want another incident to occur like the one that happened to Abhaya. Our demands are not for a union or organisation. What happened to her was an institutional murder," said Aniket Mahato, one of the representatives of the West Bengal Junior Doctors Front.

Referring to the ongoing

flood situation in the State, Dr. Mahato said doctors would resume emergency services from Saturday. The doctor said an Abhaya Clinic for flood-affected people would be set up. "We want to remind the government that our fight will go on till the safety and security reforms are completely ensured. The government should not think that the movement has stopped," he said.

The development comes a day after doctors under the banner of the West Bengal Junior Doctors Front met State's Chief Secretary Manoj Pant.

In a letter addressed to the Principal Secretary of Health and Family Welfare N.S. Nigam, Mr. Pant highlighted ten directives for safety and security of healthcare professionals which include "deployment of adequate number of police/security personnel along with female police/security personnel in every healthcare facility in consultation with Home Department". The communication also pointed out that the State government has appointed former Director General of Police Surajit Kar Purkayastha to conduct security audits of all medical colleges and hospitals.

The State government has also suggested that a

centralised helpline number as well as panic call button alarm system should also be made available in every healthcare facility. "A robust grievance redressal system should be developed to promptly address the grievances and complaints of all the stakeholders including patient and patient parties," the letter from the Chief Secretary said.

On Thursday, the Chief Minister had once again appealed to protesting doctors to return to work highlighting the flood situation.

Protest Ends:

White Revolution 2.0 to empower women, fight malnutrition: Amit Shah

NEW DELHI

Union Home and Cooperation Minister Amit Shah on Thursday launched the standard operating procedure for 'White Revolution 2.0' stating that milk dairies will aid empowerment of women and the fight against malnutrition.

Mr. Shah said that according to the western concept, a woman is considered unemployed even though she does all the work at home, but he disagreed with it. He said White Revolution 2.0 will help the inclusion of women engaged in procurement of milk in formal employment as the money will be deposited in their bank accounts. scheme aims at increasing

procurement led by cooperatives from the present 660 lakh litres per day to 1,000 lakh litres. Union Minister for Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying, and Panchayati Raj, Rajiv Ranjan Singh was also present at the launch.

Mr. Shah said that in the past 70 years, necessary changes in cooperatives were not made due to which the bodies became very successful in some

States and were left to the mercy of State governments in others. He said the government has prepared a joint proposal of two lakh primary agriculture cooperative societies (PACS), dairy and fishery cooperatives, and sent it across the country, and all the States have accepted it. He said that once these PACS are registered, there will not be a single panchayat without a PACS, dairy or fisheries cooperative society.

The Minister said once this happens, co-operatives will be able to reach the whole country, which will lead to the creation of cooperative institutions at tehsil and district levels, and State institutions will gain strength and momentum.

White Revolution 2.0 Launched:

- Union Home and Cooperation
 Minister Amit Shah launched the
 "White Revolution 2.0" initiative
 aimed at empowering women and
 combating malnutrition.
- The focus of the revolution is on increasing milk production and involving women in formal employment through dairy cooperatives.



Women Empowerment:

- Amit Shah emphasized the importance of women's inclusion in the dairy industry, stating that money from milk procurement would be directly deposited in their bank accounts.
- He highlighted the misconception that women are considered unemployed despite their household work, which the scheme aims to address.

Milk Procurement Increase:

The government aims to increase milk procurement from 660 lakh litres per day to 1,000 lakh litres per day.

This will be done through the involvement of cooperatives across the country

India abstains from voting on UNGA resolution against Israel's 'occupation'

The effort of the United Nations should be to "build bridges" between the Israeli and Palestinian sides, India said, explaining a decision to abstain from a resolution at the UN General Assembly (UNGA) that called on Israel to vacate Palestinian territories on the basis of an opinion by the International Court of Justice (ICJ). India was among 43 nations that abstained from the resolution, which was adopted by the UN body, as more than two-thirds of the countries present, a massive 124 of 181, voted in fayour of it. Sources said the resolution's call for sanctions and stopping arms exports to Israel may have also spurred India's decision to abstain.

"Our joint efforts should be directed towards bringing the two sides closer,

not drive them further apart. We should strive towards building bridges, not furthering the divides," India's Permanent Representative to the United Nations P. Harish said, in the Explanation of Vote (EoV) after the abstention.

In the explanation, Mr. Harish reiterated India's position on a two-state solution for Israel-Palestine peace, and the importance of the UN charter. He also repeated India's formulation of the violence, which blames neither Hamas for the terrorist attacks in

2023 that killed over 1,200, and the taking of about 250 hostages, nor names Israel for the reprisal bombardment of Gaza and the West Bank that has left more than 35,000 dead, including nearly 15,000 children, according UN data.

"We unequivocally condemn the terror attacks on Israel on 7 October 2023; we condemn the loss of civilian lives in the conflict: we call for an immediate ceasefire and immediate and unconditional release of all hostages; and we stand for unrestricted and sustained humanitarian assistance in the Gaza Strip," the EoV said, adding that India remains an advocate "dialogue and diplomacy".

The abstention by India was a marked departure from its previous record of voting in favour of resolutions that call upon Israel to withdraw troops from occupied Palestinian terri-

tories, including Gaza. Sources said India abstained as it had some differences over the wording of the resolution that imposes a one-year deadline on Israel to withdraw forces from the occupied territories, which some of the other abstaining countries called "unrealistic".

Indian companies have joint ventures with Israeli defence companies and manufacture, under licence, some parts which go back to parent companies in Israel, which can be sold to any one by them, officials said, while asserting that India's exports to Israel are very low.

The non-binding resolution followed two waves of bombings across Lebanon that killed about 30 people and wounded 3,000 as pagers and personal devices packed with explosives were detonated, which the Lebanese government has blamed Israel for.

India's Abstention at UNGA:







TCS retains most-valuable brand tag for third year in a row

TATA CONSULTANCY SER-**VICES** (TCS) has retained its position as India's most valuable brand with a value of \$49.7 billion for the third year in a row, according to the 2024 Kantar BrandZ Most Valuable Indian Brands report.

The Tata Group firm has held the top spot, buoyed by a 16% increase in brand value against the previous year. The report attributes this growth to the company's aggressive invest-

ments in innovation, particularly in artificial intelligence (AI) and digital transformation.TCS was followed by HDFC Bank, with a brand value of \$38.2 billion, and Airtel was placed third, with \$29.8 billion.

Seven new entrants joined the list this year, including CaratLane at No. 45 (\$2.7 billion), Kalvan Jewellers at No. 71 (\$1.6 billion), and real estate giant Lodha at No. 63 (\$1.9 billion). Godrej Properties also made a re-entry at No. 70 with a brand value of \$1.66 billion.

"Zomato's growth comes from the speed at which it has responded to consumer needs, whether it's managing expansion into smaller markets or leveraging moment marketing. The brand has been consistently led from the front.

Earth will temporarily capture a small asteroid named 2024 PT5, which will stay for two months before moving back into space.

This phenomenon, known as a "mini-moon," occurs when asteroids get caught in Earth's gravity and orbit the planet for a short time.

Although rare, <u>such occurrences provide scientists with valuable</u> <u>opportunities</u> to study near-Earth objects.

- 2024 PT5, discovered by NASA's Asteroid Terrestrial-impact Last Alert System (ATLAS), is about 33 feet long and came from the Arjuna asteroid belt.
- However, it may not fully qualify as a <u>mini-moon since it won't complete a full orbit</u> around Earth but will follow a horseshoe-shaped path.
- This event is significant because <u>studying asteroids like 2024 PT5 helps researchers</u> <u>understand the nature of asteroids that pass close to Earth</u>, potentially informing future space exploration and resource extraction efforts.



JOBS CREATED BY EXPORTS-RELATED ACTIVITIES IN INDIA, 2000-2020




