India invites foreign diplomats to J&K to see polls

Buoyed by peaceful polling and a higher voter turnout of 61% in the first phase of the Jammu & Kashmir elec-tion held on September 18, the External Affairs Minis try has invited a group of senior diplomats, mainly senior dipiomats, mainly from the U.S., European and ASEAN embassies, to visit Kashmir "for a first-hand account of the ongoing election process in J&K", sources told The

The meeting took place shortly after the Prime Minister arrived in the city for a summit-level meeting of the Quadrilateral Security Dialogue (Quad) with Mr. Biden, Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese and Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida.

"The United States' partnership with India is stronger, closer, and more dynamic than any time in history," tweeted Mr. Biden, who is in the final months of his presidency. Mr. Biden added that he was "struck" by Mr. Modi's ability to find new areas of cooperation.

The White House media pool and Indian travelling press did not have access to the bilateral talks, which the White House described as a "personal meeting".

External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar, Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri and India's Ambassador to the U.S. Vinay Mohan Kwatra were present at the meeting from the Indian side.

Key Priorities:

- **China and Russia** were highlighted as critical priorities in the bilateral meeting. Jake Sullivan, U.S. National Security Adviser, stressed that countries should refrain from supporting Russia's war machine.
- China's relationship with India and the other Quad members, including discussions on the South China Sea and North Korea, were major topics of concern. There was an emphasis that the Quad is not intended as a military alliance but a partnership for reinforcing regional peace and stability.

Quad Initiatives:

- The U.S. Coast Guard will collaborate with India, Australia, and Japan in joint exercises in the Indo-Pacific to combat piracy and expand maritime security.
- The Quad fellowship program will be expanded to include students from Southeast Asia.

1.Other Topics Discussed:

1. Health and Science Collaboration: A significant focus was on cancer research, a personal project of President Biden, after the loss of his son. The "Quad Cancer Moonshot" initiative will work on cancer screening, vaccines, and treatment, with funding from Quad members.

At least 22 killed in Israeli attack on a Gaza school

An Israeli strike on school in northern Gaza on Saturday killed at least 22 people, according to the Gaza Health Ministry, while the Israeli Army said it targeted a Hamas' com-mand center in what used to be a school.







. Type of Election:

Sri Lanka elects its president through direct popular voting.

The president is the head of state, head of government, and commander-in-chief of the armed forces.

Eligibility of Candidates:

To contest the presidential election, a candidate must:

- Be a citizen of Sri Lanka.
- Be at least 35 years old.
- Be qualified to be elected as a Member of Parliament.
- Not be holding any other paid office except as a Member of Parliament or an office for which the constitution allows dual holding.

Voting System:



The election uses the absolute majority system under the second-past-the-post (instant runoff voting) system.

If no candidate achieves over **50% of the votes** in the first round, the **second preferences** marked by voters on the ballot are considered.

Votes of the candidate who placed last are redistributed according to second preferences until a candidate obtains the majority.

. Term of Office:

The president is elected for a term of **five years**.

A person can serve as president for a maximum of two terms.

6. Election Timing:

Elections must be held at least one month before the end of the sitting president's term.

If the president's office becomes vacant due to resignation, death, or removal, a **fresh election** must be held within **three months**.

India recorded one of the greatest moments in its sporting history in Budapest on Sunday, winning the gold medals both in the Open and women's sections of the 45th Chess Olympiad.

The Indian men had been so dominant in the competition that they were almost assured of the gold with a round to spare.

In the 11th and final round match, India scored an easy victory against Slovenia. D. Gukesh, R. Praggnanandhaa and Arjun Erigaisi won their games, while Vidit Gujrathi drew. India won 3.5-0.5 against Slovenia, taking its tally to 21 points, out of the possible 22.

- P. Harikrishna and Vidit Gujrathi also contributed to the men's success. Harikrishna played on the reserve board.

For the women's team, **Divya Deshmukh** won the individual gold on the third board, finishing with **9.5 points in 11 games**. **Vantika Agrawal**, on the fourth board, secured an individual gold as well with **7.5 points in 9 games**.

Tania Sachdev played on the reserve board for the Indian women, helping the team secure **19 points**—one more than Kazakhstan, the runner-up.

Quad meet launches maritime and health initiatives

WILMINGTON (DELAWARE)

Leaders of the Ouad group of countries - Prime Minister Narendra Modi. U.S. President Joe Biden, Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese and Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida – met at their sixth summit-level meeting at Archmere Academy, Mr. Biden's former school in Claymont, Delaware, to announce a broad range of outcomes. These included the launch of a new coast guard exercise, a logistics network, expansion of maritime surveillance, and a project to combat cervical cancer.

In terms of positions, the Quad strongly condemned aggression in the East and South China Sea and expressed alarm over the war in Ukraine, noting that all four leaders had visited the country.

The 'Quad Cancer Moonshot' will involve contributions from all four countries to combat cervical cancer. India will commit \$10 million towards screening for the disease. Vaccine manufacturer Serum Institute of India and Gavi will provide up to 40 million vaccines for the region, "subject to approvals".

The countries announced the Quad-at-Sea Ship Observer Mission in 2025 to improve interoperability and maritime safety. Future coast guard missions are planned for after 2025. A logistics network pilot project was also launched, which will involve Quad countries sharing airlift capacity to support disaster response.

A Maritime Initiative for Training in the Indo-Pacific (MAITRI) to train Quad

partners "to monitor and secure their waters, enforce their laws, and deter unlawful behaviour" was also announced. India will host the first MAITRI workshop in 2025.

A maritime legal dialogue has been launched to support actions to uphold the rules-based order, the statement said.

Quad members con-

demned maritime aggression, with pointed references to situations involving China, which is currently embroiled in tensions with the Philippines, most recently over the latter's coast guard presence on the Sabina shoal, 150 km off its west coast.

"We are seriously concerned about the situation in the East and South China Seas," they said, as they expressed concern about the militarisation of disputed features and intimidation in the South China Sea.

The statement condemns the dangerous use of coast guard and maritime militia vessels and opposes the disruption of other countries' offshore resource exploitation activities.

War in Ukraine


While there was no direct mention of Russia, presumably out of consideration for India, which shares a close relationship with Moscow, the joint statement had references that have been associated with a condemnation of Russia's invasion of Ukraine, such as Quad countries offering their "unwavering" support for the United Nations Charter. The countries ex-

pressed their "deepest concern" for the war in Ukraine and its consequences.

"Each of us has visited Ukraine since the war began and seen this firsthand; we reiterate the need for a comprehensive, just, and lasting peace in line with international law. consistent with the purposes and principles of the UN Charter, including respect for sovereignty and territorial integrity," the statement says. It also notes the impact the war has had on food and energy security, especially for developing countries.

The Quad fellowship, to promote STEM education, has been expanded to include 50 scholarships worth \$5,00,000 for students from the region to study at government-funded technical institutions in India.





SIGNS ACCORDS ON CLEAN, FAIR ECONOMY

India joins 3 more IPEF pacts

MUKESH JAGOTA New Delhi, September 22

INDIA ON SUNDAY signed up to join the cleanand fair economy components, and the overarching agreement of Indo Pacific Economic Framework for Prosperity (IPEF), at Delaware in the US. The signing took place in the presence of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who was on a three-day visit to the country for the Quad Summit.

With this signing, India has formally committed to all components of the IPEF framework that it had previously agreed to join.

However, India has chosen not to participate in Pillar I, which deals with trade, opting instead for observer status in the trade negotiations.

The clean economy falls under Pillar III, and the fair economy is covered in Pillar IV of IPEF. India had already signed on to Pillar II, which focuses on supply chains. The supply chain agreement came into effect in February.

Other members of the 14nation IPEF signed agreements for Pillars III and IV, along with the overarching framework, during a ministerial meeting in Singapore in June. India was unable to sign at that time due to ongoing general elections and delays in completing domestic approval processes.

IPEF was launched in 2022 in Tokyo and includes 14 countries: Australia, Brunei, Fiji, India, Indonesia, Japan, the Republic of Korea, Malaysia, New Zealand, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Vietnam

Concerns remain, says GTRI

THE NEGOTIATIONS FOR the IPEF have been conducted "in secrecy", with limited public input, raising concerns about whether India has retained sufficient flexibility and policy space to achieve its economic goals, according to Global Trade Research Initiative (GTRI).

One major issue in the Supply Chain Pillar is whether the agreement might restrict members from trading critical materials, particularly with China.

"It's hoped that India has

negotiated enough flexibility to avoid strict clauses, such as the prohibition on export restrictions. These are crucial during emergencies, as no country can be expected to supply essential goods when facing its own crisis," GTRI noted.

In the Clean Economy Pillar, the concern is that India may have agreed to a non-derogation clause, which would prevent the government from relaxing domestic rules for projects of national importance. FE BUREAU

aims to accelerate efforts among IPEF members towards energy security and transition, climate resilience and adaptation and the mitigation of greenhouse gas emis-

sions. It also seeks to innovate ways to reduce dependence on fossil fuels and promote the deployment of clean energy and climate-friendly technologies.

According to a statement by the commerce ministry, the clean energy pact will encourage investments, project financing (including concessional financing), joint collaborative projects, workforce developmen and technical assistance. It will also support capacity building for industries, particularly micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs), and facilitate the integration of Indian companies into global value chains, especially within the Indo-Pacific region. These efforts will be carried out through joint initiatives such as Cooperative Work Programmes, the IPEF Catalytic Capital Fund and the IPEF Accelerator.

The fair economy agreement aims to create a more transparent and predictable business environment, promote a level playing field, and enhance efforts to prevent and combat corruption. It also establishes confidential systems, improves tax transparency, and facilitates the exchange of information for tax purposes.

"It focuses on enhancing information sharing among partners, facilitating asset recovery, and strengthening cross-border investigations and prosecutions. This will also support India's efforts in fighting corruption, money laundering, and terror financing," the commerce ministry said.

- One key issue is whether the IPEF will allow enough flexibility for India and other nations to meet their economic goals and ensure essential goods are available, especially during crises.



IN THE FOUR YEARS to FY24, while India's goods exports to America have remained stagnant at a tad above 23% of its total merchandise exports, shipments to Europe rose to 24% in FY24 from 20% in FY21, reports Saikat Neogi. Exports to Asia have dropped from 45% in FY21 to 40% in FY24. In April-August of the current fiscal year, share of exports to America in total exports increased to 25%, while Europe's share too rose to 25%. Asian markets, on the other hand, continued to cede ground, with their share in India's total goods exports dropping further to 38%. To be sure, while India's overall goods exports contracted 3% in FY24, shipments to America and Asia contracted 4% and 3.5% respectively. Exports to Europe, however, rose around 2% in FY24. In FY25 till August, while the overall exports grew marginally at 1%, shipments to America and Europe rose at 7.3% and 7.8%, respectively.





- The government has sanctioned ₹31,000
 crore to fence the Myanmar border, which spans 1,643 km across Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, and Mizoram.

- FMR, implemented in 2018, the Free Movement Regime (FMR) permits residents on both sides of the 1,643 km India-Myanmar border to travel up to 16 km into each other's territory without a visa.
- This requires a border pass with one-year validity, allowing a two-week stay. The border spans four states: Mizoram, Manipur, Nagaland, and Arunachal Pradesh.

Fast track immigrationtrusted traveller programme

- India has launched its first Fast Track Immigration-Trusted Traveller Programme (FTI-TTP) aimed at providing quicker immigration processing for High-Net-Worth Individuals (HNWIs), CEOs, businessmen, and Overseas Citizens of India (OCI).
- The program, operational at major airports such as Delhi and Mumbai, offers faster immigration clearance through e-gates.





Enrollees must apply online, provide biometrics at airports or Foreigners Regional Registration Offices (FRRO), and can enjoy fast-track clearance for up to five years.




The program ensures <u>secure handling of personal data and is inspired</u> by the US Global Entry system, tailored to Indian needs.

Exercise AIKYA

India Joins International Big Cat Alliance

- After an approval from the Union Cabinet, India has formally joined the International Big Cat Alliance (IBCA), by signing and ratification of the Framework Agreement of IBCA.
- International Big Cat Alliance (IBCA)
- The alliance was conceived as a multi-country, multi-agency coalition of 96 big cat range countries and others to establish a common platform for conservation.

- Objective: Focus of the Alliance is to conserve seven big cats of the world which includes Tiger, Lion, Leopard, Snow Leopard, Puma, Jaguar and Cheetah.
 - In India out of the seven big cats only five tiger, lion, leopard, snow leopard and cheetah are found.
- Funding: The government also approved a one-time budgetary support of ₹150 crore for a period of five years from 2023-24 to 2027-28.

- Governance: IBCA governance consists of an Assembly of Members, Standing Committee and a Secretariat with its Head Quarter in India.
- All UN member countries are eligible for becoming a member of IBCA.
 - So far 4 countries have become members of IBCA including India, Nicaragua, Eswatini and Somalia.
