





## ISRO plans to launch 112-day mission to the planet Venus in March 2028

BENGALURU

India's maiden mission to Venus, which is scheduled for launch in March 2028, will embark on a 112-day journey to reach the planet. The ₹1,236-crore Venus Orbiter Mission (VOM) was recently approved by the Union Cabinet and the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) on Tuesday revealed the targeted launch window for the mission.

According to the targeted launch window for VOM, the Earth departure date is scheduled on March 29, 2028, and the arrival date on Venus is July 19, 2028. VOM will be

launched by the Launch Vehicle Mark-3 (LVM-3).

"LVM-3 has been identified as the candidate launch vehicle which will place the spacecraft in an Elliptical Parking Orbit (EPO) of 170 km x 36,000 km, 21.5 degrees inclination and Argument of Perigee (AOP) of 178 degrees. Minimum energy requirement (expressed as incremental velocity, V) for the launch opportunity that exists in 2028 for placing a spacecraft in an elliptical orbit of 500 x 60,000 km around Venus," ISRO said.

The agency said that after the cruise phase, Venus Orbit Injection (VOI) will be at 500 km x 60,000 km. "Aerobraking will be em-

ployed for over a period of six to eight months from VOI to achieve the desired low altitude Science Orbit of 200 X600 km with an inclination of around 90 degrees, to carry out proposed science studies for a period of five years," it said.

ISRO said that 19 payloads will be onboard VOM, of which 16 are Indian payloads, two are Indian and international collaborative payloads, and there would be one international payload. ISRO added that VOM will explore the planet's atmosphere, surface and its interaction with the sun.

"Key objectives include examining dust in the Venusian atmosphere, mapping its topography in high resolution, studying the solar X-ray spectrum near Venus, analysing Venusian airglow, and investigating sub-surface characteristics.," it added.



- India's First Mission to Venus:
- The Venus Orbiter Mission (VOM), ISRO's maiden mission to Venus, is scheduled for launch in March 2028.
- The journey will take 112 days to reach Venus, with the arrival expected on July 19, 2028.
- The mission will be launched using LVM-3
   (Launch Vehicle Mark-3), which will place
   the spacecraft in an Elliptical Parking Orbit
   (EPO) around the Earth before transferring it
   to Venus.

As they approached Delhi on Monday, they were detained and taken to a police station and made to sleep on the floor," said Mr. Lakruk, a former member of the Bharativa Janata Party (BJP). He said that the Ladakhis would intensify their protests and de-manded that the Union manded that the Union
Home Ministry resume dialogue with the high-powered committee that was
set up in 2023 to address
their grievances.

## Sonam Wangchuk starts indefinite fast in Delhi

Ladakh Member of Parliament Mohmad Haneefa detained when he went to meet protesters at Singhu border; Rahul Gandhi slams Modi over police action; Leh Apex Body says it will intensify agitation; activists demand that Union Home Ministry resume dialogue with high-powered committee that was set up in 2023 to address grievances

adakh's Member of Parliament Mohmad Haneefa was detained by the Delhi Police on Tuesday, a day after more than a hundred protesters from Ladakh, including climate activist Sonam Wangchuk, were detained by police at the Delhi-Haryana boundary.

Mr. Wangchuk and others in police detention began an indefinite hunger strike in Delhi on Tuesday. even as Ladakh erupted in protest. The entire region shut down in outrage over the "illegal and unconstitutional" detention of the delegation which started its march to Delhi from Leh on September 1 to demand constitutional safeguards for the region. The march was to culminate at Raighat on Wednesday.

Cherring Dorjay Lakruk, co-convener of the Leh Apex Body (LAB), an influential civil society organisation, told *The Hindu* 

that he was "shocked" by the treatment meted out to peaceful protesters, including 80-year old men and women, who have been walking since September 1, traversing rocky and hilly terrain.

#### 'Protests will intensify'

"Our people are not used to walking in such heat, they have blisters on their feet. As they approached Delhi on Monday, they were detained and taken to a police station and made to sleep on the floor," said Mr. Lakruk, a former member of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP). He said that the Ladakhis would intensify their protests and demanded that the Union Home Ministry resume dialogue with the high-powered committee that was set up in 2023 to address their grievances.

The Ladakh MP said that he was detained by the police when he went to meet a group of protestors from Kargil who were stopped at the Singhu bor-

der on Tuesday morning. His phone could not be reached through much of the day.

When *The Hindu* spoke with Mr. Haneefa at noon, he said, "We don't know where the police are taking us."

"Not even a single complaint of violence has been reported since the march started. Instead, it received huge support from people in other States," Mr. Lakruk said. "The government may have been concerned with the huge support that we may get in Delhi and that people would come and join us in large numbers leading to the possibility of a law and order situation, that is why they curtailed the *padyatra* like this. The whole of Ladakh

is out on the streets today, they are angry," he added.

The Congress backed the protests, with Leader of the Opposition Rahul Gandhi stating that the detention of Ladakhis peacefully marching for environmental and constitutional rights was unacceptable. "Why are elderly citizens being detained at Delhi's border for standing up for Ladakh's future? Modi *ji*, like with the farmers, this '*Chakravyuh*' will be broken, and so will your arrogance. You will have to listen to Ladakh's voice," he said in a post on X.

Delhi Chief Minister Atishi was not allowed to meet Mr. Wanghchuk, who has been detained at Bawana police station. A heavy police force was deployed outside the station and its entrance was barricaded.

"The Flag Officer has the rare distinction of serving in all three branches of the Indian Armed Forces, having served as Lieutenant to Captain in the Indian Army, from Surgeon Lieutenant to Surgeon Vice-Admiral in the Indian Navy and as an Air Marshal in the Indian Air Force," the Ministry said. She is an alumna of AFMC, Pune and was commissioned into AFMS in December 1985.

### Monsoon ends with 8% more rainfall than normal in season: IMD

NEW DELHI

The southwest monsoon this year was 8% over its long-term average, however, rainfall is likely to continue in October and November with above-normal rainfall expected, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said on Tuesday.

About 35% of the country received excess rainfall and slightly over half, or 54%, received normal rainfall. Monthly rainfall over the country as a whole was 89% of the average in June, 9% more than normal of July, 15% above the normal of August, and 12% over the normal of September.

The actual monsoon performance – of above average rainfall – is in line with what the agency has forecast since July.

During the monsoon months, the agency had said that a key factor for bountiful rainfall would be La Nina, or a minimum half a degree cooling of the Central Equatorial Pacific, that was to have set in by September. This, however, has not happened with most of the international climate models, including India's, going wrong on this factor. "We don't know

specifically why La Nina hasn't set in but most models, on average, give a 71% chance for La Nina to set in during October, November, and December," said M. Mohapatra, Director-General, IMD.

The main reason for good rainfall was the formation of several low pressure systems, or moisture-laden winds from the Arabian Sea or the Bay of Bengal, with 14 of them having formed from June to September.

#### October-December rain

According to the IMD's forecast, the rainfall over south peninsular India consisting of five meteorological subdivisions (Tamil Nadu, coastal Andhra Pradesh, Rayalaseema, Kerala, and south interior Karnataka) during the post-monsoon season from October to December will likely be above normal, or at least 12% more than what is usual for the three months combined. The average rainfall from 1971 to 2020 is about 33 centimetres.

However, most parts of northwest India, some parts of northeast India, and southernmost parts of India are likely to receive normal to below-normal rainfall.

### Overall Monsoon Performance:

- The southwest monsoon delivered 8% more rainfall than the long-term average.
- About 35% of the country received excess rainfall, while 54% received normal rainfall.
- The monthly rainfall across the country was 89% of the average in June, 9% above the normal for July, 15% above the normal for August, and 12% over the normal for September.

### **Rainfall Distribution:**

The formation of low-pressure systems and moisture-laden winds from the Arabian Sea and Bay of Bengal were the main contributors to the excess rainfall.

IMD had predicted La Nina to set in by September, which usually leads to bountiful rains, but this has not occurred yet.





  - It was constructed in 1860 with a total land area of 90 acres and was taken over by the Nizam of Hyderabad after independence.




