
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

The top court directed the revision of prison manuals within three months. It ordered the deletion of the 'caste column' and any references to caste from registers of undertrials and convicts maintained in prisons. The court underscored that members of denotified tribes must not be

The judgment declared that compelling marginalised caste inmates to perform tasks like cleaning latrines or sweeping based purely on their caste, constituted a form of coercion.

The court held that the Prohibition of Employment as Manual Scavengers and their Rehabilitation Act, 2013, which prohibit manual scavenging, has a binding effect in prisons as well.

The court directed the Union government to make the necessary changes to address caste-based discrimination in the 2016 Manual and the 2023 Act within three months.

Supreme Court Judgment:

- The Supreme Court ruled that caste-based discrimination and segregation of work in prisons violate fundamental human dignity.
- Segregation of inmates based on caste hierarchy or categorizing certain groups, like the de-notified tribes, as "habitual offenders" is oppressive and unconstitutional.

- Key Directives by the Court:
- **Prison Manuals Revision:** States and Union Territories are directed to revise their Prison Manuals or rules within three months.
- Removal of 'Caste Column': References to "caste" in prison registers and documents must be removed.
- Elimination of 'Habitual Offender' References: Any reference to habitual offenders based on caste in prison documents is deemed unconstitutional.
- Address Caste-Based Discrimination: The Centre must address caste-based discrimination in the Model Prison Manual 2016 and the Model Prisons and Correctional Services Act 2023.

Constitutional Perspective:

- The court reaffirmed that everyone is born equal, and lifelong stigma based on caste cannot persist in a democratic society.
- Article 17 of the Constitution: The judgment underscored that caste-based discrimination, especially in assigning tasks like cleaning or sweeping based on caste, violates Article 17, which prohibits untouchability.

Historical Reference:

The judgment acknowledged that despite 75 years of independence, the country has yet to fully eliminate caste discrimination.

The court emphasized the need for the state to refrain from perpetuating caste discrimination, especially in correctional facilities.

Prohibition of Manual Scavenging:

The Prohibition of Employment as Manual Scavengers and Their Rehabilitation Act, 2013, was highlighted as binding in prisons as well.

Compelling marginalized caste inmates to perform menial tasks based solely on caste is declared unconstitutional and a form of coercion.





U.K. to return Chagos Islands to Mauritius in historic agreement

Negotiations for this deal began under the previous government in 2022; the deal comes after 11 rounds of talks with the previous govt. and two rounds with the current govt.; India says this understanding completes 'decolonisation' of Mauritius

he U.K. and Mauritius have reached a historic political agreement to secure the strategically important U.K.-U.S. military base on Diego Garcia and towards restoring Mauritian sovereignty over the Chagos archipelago. A treaty is now being worked out to firm up the agreement, the U.K. announced on Thursday.

"For the first time in more than 50 years, the status of the base will be undisputed and legally secure, following a political agreement between the U.K. and Mauritius," the



Diego Garcia, a significant atoll in the Indian Ocean, is part of the Chagos archipelago and the British Indian Ocean Territory. AP

U.K. High Commission in India said in a statement. "It sees Mauritius assume sovereignty over British Indian Ocean Territory (BIOT), with the U.K. authorised to exercise the sovereign rights of Mauritius on

Diego Garcia."

The political agreement is subject to a treaty and supporting legal instruments being finalised and both sides have committed to complete this as quickly as possible, it said.

Welcoming the agreement on the return of Mauritian sovereignty over the Chagos archipelago, including Diego Garcia, India's Ministry of External Affairs said this "significant" understanding completes the "decolonisation" of Mauritius, "The resolution of the long-standing Chagos dispute after two years of negotiations, in compliance with international law, is a welcome development," the MEA said in a statement.

India has consistently supported the Mauritian claim for sovereignty over Chagos, in line with its principled stand on decolonisation and support for the sovereignty and territorial integrity of nations, as well as its long-standing and close partnership with Mauritius, the MEA noted. India remains committed to working with Mauritius and other like-minded partners in strengthening maritime safety and security and contributing to enhanced peace and prosperity in the Indian Ocean region, it added.

Negotiations for this deal began under the previous government in 2022 and this week's deal comes after 11 rounds of negotiations with the previous government and two rounds of negotiations with the current government.

- It is an overseas territory of the United Kingdom that was established on November 8, 1965.
- Its key islands include the **Diego Garcia atoll**, **Danger Island**, Egmont Islands, Eagle Islands, Nelsons Island, Peros Banhos atoll. (**Diego Garcia island**, which houses a strategic US military base).
- Climate: It experiences a tropical marine climate with high temperatures and elevated humidity levels. The island's climate is heavily moderated by the trade winds which blow over the islands.

Chagos Island Dispute

- The Chagos dispute centres around the archipelago in the Indian Ocean, which Britain claimed along with Mauritius in 1814.
- In 1966, Britain leased Diego Garcia, the largest of the Chagos Islands, to the United States, which was seeking a military base in the region.
- The Chagossians, who are mostly descendants of African slaves brought to the islands in the 18th century, have since been engaged in a prolonged legal battle for the right to return to their homeland.
- Mauritius, which gained independence from Britain in 1968, has consistently maintained its claim over the Chagos Islands.

• Historic Agreement:

- The U.K. and Mauritius have reached a significant political agreement.
- This agreement secures the U.K.-U.S. military base on Diego Garcia and restores Mauritian sovereignty over the Chagos Archipelago.

What led to the Iran-Israel war?

IRAN THIS WEEK launched around 200 ballistic missiles at targets in Israel in response to the killing of Hezbollah secretary-general Hassan Nasrallah in Beirut last week. The region is now bracing for broadening of the conflict as Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu immediately pledged to retaliate and said Iran "made a big mistake and will pay", as the US rallied behind its close ally.

The Israel Defence Forces (IDF) said on Thursday that they had killed 15 Hezbollah militants in a strike in southern Lebanon. The strike came after at least eight Israeli soldiers were killed in clashes with Hezbollah in southern Lebanon, where Israel announced the start of what it says is a limited ground incursion earlier this week. In a separate development, Iran-backed Houthi rebels in Yemen said they had launched two drones at Tel Aviv overnight. The escalating violence in Lebanon has opened a second front in the war between Israel and Iranbacked militants that began nearly a year ago with Hamas' surprise October 7 attack from the Gaza Strip into Israel.

India's trade with Iran, Israel & Lebanon

INDIA HAS EXTENSIVE bilateral trade with Iran, Israel and Lebanon, though exports as well as imports (except for imports from Lebanon) saw a significant decline in FY24, and escalating tensions are likely to further impact shipments. India's exports to Israel in FY24 stood at \$4.5 billion, with petroleum products, machinery parts, gems and jewellery constituting the bulk. Imports from Israel, led by textiles, machinery and equipment, aircraft parts, gems and jewellery, were worth \$2 billion.

Iran is another important trade partner for India, with exports at \$1.2

billion in FY24 and imports at \$625 million. Cereals, organic chemicals and machinery parts are the major exports while imports are led by chemicals, fruits and nuts, petrol and petroleum products.

Exports to Lebanon in FY24 stood at \$344 million and imports at \$112 million. Cereals are the top export item, followed by meat products, oilseeds and other agro products, and chemicals and pharmaceutical products. From Lebanon, the major imports are salt, sulphur, earth and stone, plastering material, lime and cement followed by iron, steel and aluminium.

Oil prices up, stock markets spooked

GLOBAL UNCERTAINTIES CAUSED by the conflict have already unnerved the stock markets. The Nifty 50 index closed 2.12% lower at 25,250.1 points on Thursday, while the S&P BSI Sensex shed 2.1% to 82,497.1. The benchmarks posted their worst session since early August.

Oil prices rose for a third consecutive day on Thursday, reaching towards \$75 a barrel on average, though a stronger global supply outlook kept a lid on gains. There are concerns that an escalation could

prompt Iran to block the Strait of Hormuz or attack Saudi infrastructure, as it did in 2019, Panmure Gordon analyst Ashley Kelty told Reuters. India's LNG imports from Oatar and oil from Iraq and Saudi Arabia also come through the Strait of Hormuz, Iraq, Saudi Arabia, the UAE and Kuwait are the major West Asian suppliers of oil to India. Even Russian oil imports reach India via the Red Sea and in case of a wider conflict, the shipments will have to take the longer route via the Cape of Good Hope.

Impact on India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor plan

THE CONFLICTIN West Asia could slow down the progress of the India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor (IMEC) plan, announced by India, the US, the United Arab Emirates, Saudi Arabia, Italy, France, Germany, and the European Commission on the sidelines of the G20

Summit last year. The plan was aimed at creating a faster route connecting India to the Gulf region and Europe, reducing dependence on the Suez Canal. However, with the eruption of war in West Asia, the development of this trade route may face challenges.

Google set to revive lost Indian languages To Create Digital Records, Online Footprint

New Delhi: As it gets deeper into India with generative AI platform Gemini and other suite of digital offerings, Google has taken up a new task in hand — reviving some of the lost Indian languages and creating digital records and online footprint for them. The idea is to enable people to easily carry out voice or text searches in their local dialects and languages.

As the work moves towards completion, people in the hinterland and various regions can easily do voice search in their own languages to gain accurate and valuable information from, say, Google's Gemini AI platform or carry out live translations, harness YouTube better to target their communities.

The project has so far reached 59 Indian languages, including 15 that currently do not have any kind of a digital footprint and were rather declining in usage. "We've been looking at inclusive AI as a key theme for our work. How do we develop AI in a manner that brings its benefits to everyone, especially the billionplus Indians and likewise. And, one of the areas that we





- Rosh Hashanah is Jewish New Year and is among the most sacred days in the Jewish faith.
- It marks the beginning of the Jewish month of Tishri, which is the 7th month according to the Hebrew calendar.




- It is believed by the Jewish community to be the day when God created the world, including Adam and Eve.

- Yom Kippur means "Day of Atonement" on which Jewish people pray, seek forgiveness and a fresh start.




Fun fact
