India did not sign letter of support by 104 nations for UN Secretary-General after ban by Israel

India was a notable exclusion from a letter signed by 104 countries, including European and African countries, as well as much of the Global South, that "condemned" Israel for banning United Nations Secretary-General Antonio Guterres from entering Israeli territory.

While India has broken with the Global South on a number of resolutions that are critical of Israel, abstaining in at least four such major resolutions on Palestinian issues, the decision not to sign the letter

'Deep concern'

Most neighbouring countries in South Asia, West

Asia, South America, and Africa signed the letter that was circulated at the UN last week. The letter said that the 105 signatories, including 104 member-states and the African Union, expressed "deep concern with and condemnation" of Israel's decision to declare the Secretary-General persona non grata (PNG). "Such actions undermine the United Nations' ability to carry out its mandate, which includes mediating conflicts and providing humanitarian support," the letter said.

Israel's order, declaring Mr. Guterres PNG on October 2, had been issued by

its Foreign Minister Israel Katz, who accused the UN Secretary-General of not criticising Iranian missile strikes on Israel a day before that "unequivocally", although Mr. Guterres had issued statements on Iran's actions both before and after the ban. Mr. Katz said that Mr. Guterres did "not deserve to step foot on Israeli soil" as a consequence.

The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) did not respond to requests for comments on why India did not sign on to the letter.

Chinese naval fleet docks at Bangladesh port

A Chinese naval fleet visited Bangladesh on Saturday, becoming the first foreign fleet to do so since the interim government took charge in Dhaka in early August. China-Bangladesh relations will continue to grow irrespective of the recent political changes in Dhaka, China's Ambassador to Bangladesh Yao Wen said on the occasion.

"No matter what changes have taken place in the domestic situation of Bangladesh, China's commitment to develop China-Bangladesh relations re-

mains unchanged. China is looking forward to working closely with Bangladesh to cement our traditional friendship, deepen friendly exchanges and mutually beneficial cooperation in various areas, promote high quality Belt and Road cooperation," the Chinese embassy in Dhaka said in a statement.

Earlier, Mr. Yao Wen and the Commanders of the Chinese naval fleet, Qi Jiguang and Jing Gangshan, met Rear Admiral Masud Igbal, Commander of the Chattogram Naval Area, Rear Admiral Mohammed Moinul Hassan, Commander of the Bangladesh Navy Fleet, and Rear Admiral S. M. Moniruzzaman, chairman of the Chittagong Port Authority. The two sides discussed plans to further strengthen maritime and security cooperation between the Bangladeshi and Chinese naval forces.

Strategic partnership

China and Bangladesh are "comprehensive strategic cooperative partners", Mr. Yao Wen said. The last significant visit between the

two countries was by Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina in July 8 to 10 when she reportedly cut short her trip to return to Dhaka and deal with the student agitation there.

Chittagong dock

Bangladesh has been building a dock in Chittagong with Chinese help. The facility had earlier attracted attention as it has the potential to host submarines and warships.

However, in May this year, the *South China Morning Post* cited experts saying that New Delhi was "not overly concerned", indicating that the warm political ties between

Sheikh Hasina and India would prevent such a possibility.

On Saturday, the Chinese PLANTask Group 83 reached the Chittagong port, amidst fanfare as Chinese and Bangladeshi citizens waved national flags. The Chinese fleet will be stationed in the Chittagong Port for four days and host a series of events, including bilateral meetings, deck receptions, and ship open days to enhance "China and Bangladesh Navy cooperation and mutual trust, and contribute to the building of a maritime community of shared future," the Chinese embassy in Dhaka said.



U.S. to send missile defence system and troops to Israel

The delivery of THAAD battery risks further inflaming the conflict in West Asia; Pentagon spokesperson says the deployment underscores United States' commitment to defence of Israel

he United States will send a Terminal High Altitude Area Defence (THAAD) battery to Israel, along with the troops needed to operate it, the Pentagon said on Sunday, even as Iran warned Washington to keep American military forces out of Israel.

Maj. Gen. Pat Ryder, Pentagon spokesperson, said in a statement that Defence Secretary Lloyd Austin authorised the deployment of the THAAD battery at the direction of President Joe Biden. He said the system will help bolster Israel's air defences following Iran's ballistic missile attacks on Israel in April and October.

The delivery of the sophisticated missile defence system risks further inflaming the conflict in the West Asia despite widespread diplomatic efforts to

avoid an all-out war. The Iranian warning came in a post on X long associated with Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi, who noted the earlier reports that the United States was considering the deployment.

Israeli forces and Hezbollah fighters in Lebanon have been clashing since October 8, 2023, when the Lebanese militant group began firing rockets over the border in support of its ally Hamas in Gaza. Late last month, Israel launched a ground invasion into Lebanon.

Military response

Israel is widely believed to be preparing a military response to Iran's October 1 attack when it fired roughly 180 missiles into Israel.

In a brief exchange with presspersons before leaving Florida on Sunday, Mr. Biden said he agreed to deploy the THAAD battery "to defend Israel".

Mr. Biden spoke at Mac-Dill Air Force Base in Tampa after making a quick visit to to see the damage caused by Hurricane Milton and meet with first responders, residents and local leaders.

Mr. Ryder, in his statement, said the deployment "underscores the United States' ironclad commitment to the defence of Israel, and to defend Americans in Israel, from any further ballistic missile attacks by Iran".

It was not immediately clear where the THAAD battery was coming from or when it will arrive. Lt. Col. Nadav Shoshani, an Israeli Army spokesperson, declined to provide any timeline for its arrival, but thanked the U.S. for its support.

The THAAD is considered a complementary system to the Patriot, but it can defend a wider area. It can hit targets at ranges of 150 to 200 kilometres.





The 15th-century explorer Christopher Columbus was a Sephardic Jew from Western Europe, Span-ish scientists said on Saturday, after using DNA

analysis to tackle a centuries-old mystery.
Several countries have argued over the origins and the final burial place of the divisive figure who led Spanish-funded expeditions from the 1490s led Spanish-funded expeditions from the 1809s. onward, opening the way for the European con-quest of the Americas. To solve the mystery, re-searchers conducted a 22-year investigation, led samples of remains buried in Seville Cathedral, long marked by authorities there as the last resi-ting place of Columbus, though there had been riv-al claims. They compared them with those of known relatives and descendants and their find-lumbus DNA. Chinese Premier Li Qiang could inaugurate operations at a Chinese-funded airport in Pakistan's Balochistan province during his visit to the country in the coming week, Pakistan's Information Minister Attaullah Tarar told presspersons on Sunday.

The start of operations at the \$200-million Gwadar International Airport has been pushed back for a security review after deadly attacks by separatist militants in August in the area, government and aviation sources said.

Mr. Li, along with Ministers and government officials will visit Pakistan from Monday, Pakistan's Foreign Affairs Ministry said on Sunday.

Pakistan is hosting the meeting of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO), which comprises nine full members, including China, India, Iran and Russia, and is scheduled for October 15 and 16 in Islamabad.

The new airport will handle domestic and international flights, according to Pakistan's Civil Aviation Authority, and will be one of the country's biggest airports.

The initial plan was for Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif to inaugurate the airport on August 14 alongside Chinese officials, but that was called off after an ethnic Baloch rights group started a sit-in protest, the officials said.







In engineering feat, mechanical SpaceX arms catch Starship rocket booster back at launch pad

Co Demonstrates Key Tech Needed To Make Booster Completely Reusable

paceX pulled off a feat of technical wizardry on Sunday, not only flying a 233-foot rocket booster back to its launch site, but also catching it out of the air with two giant mechanical arms.

The event, which occurred during the latest test flight of the Starship rocket, was a major step forward for the ambitions of SpaceX and its founder. Elon Musk, which include one day taking people to Mars. In the more immediate future, Nasa is paying SpaceX \$4 billion to take astronauts to the surface of the moon during two upcoming missions in its Artemis

programme. A jubilant Elon Musk called it "science fiction without the fiction part". "The tower has caught the rocket!!" Musk announced via X. "Big step towards making life multiplanetary was made today."

Not only has Musk's company built and flown the world's largest and most powerful rocket, it has also demonstrated a key technology needed to make the vehicle completely reusable and able to fly again and again quickly, more like a jetliner than a rocket Bill Nelson, the Nasa administrator, congratulated SpaceX on flight in a post on X. "As we prepare to go back to

As the booster descends close to the launch tower, the arms ('chopsticks') close gently around the booster, catching it before it hit the ground

100 metric tonnes to orbit.

After the Super Heavy booster, the rocket's first stage, successfully pushed Starship upward through the densest part of the atmosphere, it dropped away as the upper-stage spacecraft, continued to head toward space. The booster then ignited some of its 33 engines, looking like a giant cigarette falling at an angle, with the glow of the engines at the bottom. Flames rose along one side of the boosck it off course. As the booster descended close to launch toound the booster, catching it before it hit the ground. When the engines switched off, the booster was still hanging in midair. A small fire continued to burn at the base of the booster, but the flames soon extinguished.

On the previous Starship test flight, the booster performed similar maneuvers, but over the Gulf of Mexico.

The return of the booster to the launch site was similar to how the first stage of SpaceX's Falcon 9 rocket re-enters the atmosphere before landing on a floating platform or a landing pad. SpaceX now does that routinely, but the boos-

SpaceX also plans to use those arms to catch Starships when they return from orbit. As the launch tower caught the booster in Texas, the upper-stage Starship spacecraft continued on an arc into space toward the Indian Ocean. essentially the same trajectory as the last flight. For this flight, SpaceX improved the thermal protection on Starship so that it could better withstand the searing heat of re-entry. On the previous flight, the flaps that control the descent almost burned up and disintegrated. NYT

LADAKH WITNESSES RARE SPECTACLE







 On October 10, 2024, Leh, Ladakh experienced a rare display of aurora borealis, or northern lights, due to a severe geomagnetic storm triggered by a coronal mass ejection (CME) from the Sun.



- Why auroras occur:
- Caused by solar activity: Auroras occur due to the interaction of charged particles from the Sun, known as the solar wind, with Earth's magnetic field.
- Solar wind and earth's magnetic field: As the solar wind reaches Earth, most particles are deflected by the planet's magnetic field. However, some particles get trapped and travel toward the poles.

- Interaction with atmospheric gases: These charged particles collide with gases like oxygen and nitrogen in the upper atmosphere, producing light. Oxygen emits green hues, while nitrogen produces blue and purple tones.
- <u>Influence of solar flares and CMEs:</u> During strong solar activity, like solar flares or coronal mass ejections (CMEs), the solar wind intensifies, leading to geomagnetic storms. These storms can cause auroras to expand to mid-latitudes, making them visible in regions farther from the poles.
