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

xternal Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar and his Pakistani counterpart Ishaq Dar held an "informal interaction" at the conclusion lunch for the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) Council of Heads of Government meeting in Islamabad on Wednesday.

Officials confirmed the interaction even as a short video clip that appeared online showed the Ministers of the two countries speaking at a table seated next to each other.

The lunch was hosted by Pakistan's Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif who chaired the SCO session where, unlike on past occasions, both India's and Pakistan's national statements avoided contentious language on sensitive issues.

According to sources, Mr. Jaishankar had also

held a brief discussion with Mr. Dar at the SCO dinner on Tuesday evening as well, where they were joined by Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi, who is also Chairperson of the Pakistan Cricket Board. Pakistan has been keen to host the Indian team as part of the Champions Trophy due to be held in Pakistan in early 2025, but the Board of Control for Cricket in India has not confirmed their participation.

## Neetu, de Villiers and Cook inducted into ICC Hall of Fame

Former India spinner Neetu David, who still holds the record for the best figures (eight for 53) by a woman in an individual Test innings, on Wednesday became only the second female cricketer from the country to be inducted into the ICC Hall of Fame.

South African legend AB de Villiers and former England captain Alastair Cook were also inducted along with David.

David, the current chairman of selectors for Indian women's team, enters the ICC Hall of Fame a year after the induction of former captain Diana Edulji.

David made more than 100 appearances (10 Tests and 97 ODIs) for India as a prolific left-arm spinner and was inducted alongside South Africa and England legends AB de Villiers and Alastair Cook, joining a long list of great cricketers.

The 47-year-old David is the second-highest wickettaker for India in ODIs cricket with 141 scalps and was also the first female player from the country to claim 100 wickets in the 50-over game.

Topping the wicket-taking list at the World Cup in 2005, to inspire her country to their first-ever final, is also among her standout achievements.

David said in an ICC release: "It is truly an honour to be inducted into the ICC Hall of Fame, something that I consider to be the highest recognition available to anyone who puts on their national team jersey.

"This comes after a lifetime of dedication to this great sport, and caps a very special journey for me".

- Out of 112 inductees in the ICC Cricket Hall of Fame, 82 are from England, Australia and the West Indies, while the other 30 inductees are from the remaining Test playing nations, India, New Zealand, Pakistan, South Africa, Sri Lanka and Zimbabwe.
- In 2024 it was reported that all three New Zealand inductees were listed as Australian on the ICC's official Hall of Fame website


## Looks to deploy 75,000 sites over next 3 years

JATIN GROVER New Delhi, October 16

VODAFONE IDEAIS planning to roll out its 5G services in December and expects around 45-50 million users shifting to the network. The company is looking to deploy 75,000 5G sites over the next three years, said Jagbir Singh, chief technology officer, Vodafone Idea. The telecom company is riding on its recent fundraise and the ₹30,000-crore deal with Ericsson, Nokia and Samsung for supply of 4G and 5G network equipment.

Singh said since 5G monetisation is currently seen on the 5G fixed wireless access (FWA) broadband service, Vodafone Idea is targeting to launch Vi AirFiber by next year, for which it has been doing trials with its vendor partners.

On Tuesday, Aditya Birla group chairman Kumar Mangalam Birla had exuded confidence about Vodafone Idea scripting a



turnaround with its recent fundraise and capex cycle. He said the company is on a more secure footing and remains dynamic and competitive, and with government's continued support, the company will do its part in realising India's digital destiny.

"We are not going to be too aggressive on 5G, we will go by case-to-case basis depending on how the 5G is growing, how the use cases and device penetration are happening," Singh said, adding that the companywill first roll out the services in big cities to tap a high Arpu (average revenue per user) base.

## India, Australia to speed up negotiations for trade pact

MUKESH JAGOTA New Delhi, October 16

#### TRADE NEGOTIATORS FROM India and Australia will intensify their engagement on the proposed Comprehensive Economic Cooper-

ation Agreement (CECA) over the next two months to achieve a closure before Australia enters the election phase.

"Ministers have guided the officials to see if the CECA can be expedited. We will be engaging with each other over the next two months to see that those sensitivities can be brought down and can be reduced until we can achieve a closure," additional secretary in the department of commerce Rajesh Agrawal said.

"Otherwise Australia goes for election next year, maybe agreement will go beyond that. Depending on the work we are able to do in these two months," he added. Commerce and industry minister Piyush

Goyal was in Australia late last month for wide-ranging discussions on trade and economic ties between the two countries.

The CECA builds on the Economic Cooperation and Trade Agreement which was in the nature of an early harvest deal. To the five subjects or policy areas that ECTA

covered, 14 more have been added in the proposed CECA. On review of the Asean-India Trade in Goods Agreement (AITIGA), India is seeking to address tariff asymmetries that Indian exports suffer and the demand was reiterated at the Asean-India Economic Ministers Meeting and bilateral meetings with member states by minister Goyal.

Asean members include Brunei Darussalam, Cambodia, Indonesia, Lao PDR, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam. India maintains that while it has eliminated tariffs on 74% of the products for all 10 Asean members, it has got different levels of zero-duty access in each country.

"What we have got is higher tariff elimination from low order economies and low tariff elimination from fast growing and big economies. This tariff asymmetry needs to be addressed so that it is a balanced FTA... It has been appreciated and acknowledged by the Asean side," Agrawal said. India and Asean goods trade agreement came into force in January 2010.

"We are discussing the issue with them. We would like to go countrywise (on tariff concessions). Asean is a 10-country bloc and not a customs union," commerce secretary Sunil Barthwal said.

"We would like to see a certain amount of differentiation because all of them are at different levels of economic development. This will give us latitude to have a better fit of the tariff concessions. As practice Asean does not follow it. They like to have a single set of concessions. We are trying to discuss it and trying to see what flexibility we can build in the review so that asymmetries can be ironed out," Agrawal said.

In the recently concluded 9th round of negotiations on the India-European Union FTA, both sides focussed on core trade issues covering goods services, investment and government procurement along with rules of origin (ROO), sanitary and phytosanitary measures, technical barriers to trade and trade remedies. The proposed India-EU-FTA has 23 policy areas or chapters and discussions were held on 20 of them. In the meeting, India also raised concerns around carbon tax and other measures the EU is taking that will result in barriers to trade and increase costs. On the India-UK trade talks, another official said that resumption of negotiations are expected only after November after the new government presents its first budget on October 30.

The agreement cuts tariffs on a range of Australian exports to India, including coal, lentils, sheep meat and wool, lobsters and rare earths.

It also promises a phased reduction of tariffs on wine and other agricultural products, including avocados, cherries, nuts, blueberries, almonds, oranges, mandarins, pears and strawberries.

Offence of 'Abetment of Suicide'



Recently, the Supreme Court has interpreted the crime of 'abetment of suicide,' detailing the criteria for determining guilt in such cases.

What is Abetment of Suicide?

About:

Abetment of suicide is an offence under Section 306 of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) (Section 108 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS)).

- The punishment for this crime is **up to** 10 **years of imprisonment** and a fine.
- Section 45 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) defines abetment as when a person either instigates someone to commit an act, conspires with others to do something (leading to an illegal act or omission), or intentionally aids in its execution.



sc's Interpretation: The offence requires "direct and alarming encouragement or incitement" that leaves no option but fatal step.

The court laid down following guidelines to determine whether a situation involved unbearable harassment or emotional exploitation that drove the deceased to suicide.

The accused created unbearable harassment or torture, leading the victim to view suicide as the only escape.

The accused exploited the victim's emotional vulnerability, making them feel worthless or undeserving of life.

The accused threatened harm to the victim's family or caused financial ruin.

The accused made false allegations that damaged the victim's reputation, leading to public humiliation and loss of dignity.

### Related Cases:

- *M Mohan v The State, 2011:* The SC ruled that proving abetment of suicide under Section 306 IPC requires a direct act with intent, leaving the victim no option but suicide.
- *Ude Singh v State of Haryana, 2019:* The SC held that proving abetment of suicide depends on case specifics, requiring direct or indirect incitement that leaves the victim no choice but suicide.

- Surge in Student Suicides: Student suicides in India have surged by 4% annually, outpacing the overall suicide rate increase of 2%, despite a likely "under reporting" of student suicide cases.
- Gender Disparity: In 2022, male students constituted 53% of total student suicides. While male suicides decreased by 6% from 2021, female student suicides saw a 7% rise.



**Decade Trend:** Over the past decade, despite a slight decrease in the **0-24 age** group population, student suicides **rose significantly from 6,654 to 13,044**.

State-Wise Distribution: Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, and Madhya Pradesh reported the highest numbers of student suicides, collectively accounting for one-third of the national total.





#### About Taiwan

• Taiwan is located in the East China Sea. between China. Japan. and the Philippines. making it a critical player in East and Southeast Asia. Its location is key for regional trade, especially because the Taiwan Strait is a busy waterway.

- Any conflict in this region could have far-reaching effects. especially on the economies of nearby countries. Southeast Asia, in particular, relies on stable trade through the Taiwan Strait, and a military conflict would threaten this balance.
- Since 1949. after the Chinese Civil War. Taiwan has functioned independently. but China continues to view Taiwan as a breakaway province. While Taiwan operates like a separate nation, with its own government and president.

- Only 11 countries officially recognize Taiwan. Most other nations, including the United States, acknowledge China's One China policy but maintain unofficial relations with Taiwan.
- While most countries don't officially recognize Taiwan as a separate country, they are very concerned about any potential conflict between China and Taiwan. A war could disrupt global trade, especially in industries like electronics, where Taiwan plays a significant role in manufacturing.


