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

Ministry asks social media firms to curb bomb hoax posts

The Ministry of Electronics and Information Technoloand Information Technology on Friday informed so-cial media companies that it was their duty to curb posts raising threats to the posts raising threats to the safety of flights operating from India. "The scale of spread of such hoax bomb threats has been observed to be dangerously unres-trained due to the availabil-ity of the option of 'for-warding' re-sharing' re-posting' re-tweeting' on the social media plat-forms,' the Ministry said in

an advisory.
Earlier this week, Ministry officials reportedly met
with social media platforms, with an official critirorms, with an ornicial criti-cising X in particular for "abetting" these threats. The company said in a statement later that it was

In this advisory, for instance, the Ministry wrote stance, the Ministry wrote that "social media interme-diaries have a due dili-gence obligation under the Information Technology Act, 2000 and the Information Technology (Inter mediary Guidelines and mediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules, 2021, to promptly remove such misinforma-tion that affects public or-der and security of the State*.

This approach was also reflected earlier this year, when deepfake videos of celebrities spread widely. In that case, the Ministry chose to leverage a broader interpretation of the IT Rules, 2021.

The consequences for social media platforms if they find themselves noncompliant with the IT Rules are that they lose protection against inter mediary liability. This would enable them to be would enable them to be sued as publishers of such posts. In Friday's advisory, the Ministry said that plat-forms that do not perform the "due diligence" in this view of the law could face legal action under the III act, and under the Bharati-ya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023.

No more long treks; tribal hamlet gets its first grocery store

The community-owned shop has been set up in Pudukadu village nestled within the Sathyamangalam Tiger Reserve in Tamil Nadu; the store brings relief to people who struggled with sparse modes of transport and the threat of wild animals when traversing the forest to buy essential goods

or 35 tribal families in Pudukadu, a small hamlet nestled within the Sathyamangalam Tiger Reserve (STR), the simple task of buying provisi involves an arduous trek of at least 15 kilometres, on at reast 15 kilometres, sometimes even 54 kilometres. Saturday was a red letter day for them, when a provision shop was opened within their

village. Rights Education and Rights Education and Development Centre (READ), an NGO based in Sathyamangalam, has set up a community-owned shop in the village to serve the people there. Located 18 kilometres from

Hasanur in the Talamalai Reserve Forest, the village is only accessible via a one-km mud road branching off from the Mavallam-Kottadai road. Most residents are daily-wage earners, while a few own plots of rain-fed

As part of its participatory rural appraisal programme, the NGO engaged with the community to address six interlinked issues: health and household care, leadership, family and community cohesion, education, earnings, and finance. Familles pointed out their difficulty in accessing stores in Arepalayam (15 km away), Talawadi (52 km), or Sathyamangalam (54 km), and household care

Life-changing move R. Arulsamy, the councillor for Ward 6 of the panchayat, noted that only a few buses are

available for the people to reach the shops in nearby towns, while they face the threat of wild animals when traversing the forest. Pudukadu resident G. Vinitha, 37, said that waiting for the bus to

reach Hasanur to buy provisions has been a time-consuming affair so far, often taking half-a-day for each trip to the shop. "Now, we can get essentials in our own big change in our life," she said. READ director R.

Karuppasamy told *The* Hindu that the difficulty in accessing essential commodities was a major straint for thes families. With the support of a foundation, it was decided to start a shop. "We took a few families and purchased essentials for t50,000 from a wholesale shop in Sathyamangalam," he said, adding that a resident would manage the shop families. With the support

\$25-mn pandemic fund goes to curb 'zoonotic' diseases

The Union government has launched a project to improve animal health security in a partnership

he Centre has start-ed work on the \$25-million G-20 pan-demic fund project to im-prove animal health in india as part of an effort to improve the preparedness and response to pandemics. Union Animal Husban-dry Mipister Pairs Rapian

dry Minister Rajiv Ranjan Singh launched the project on Friday. It is designed to enhance the country's "animal health security" by upgrading and expand-ing animal health laboratories and developing labora-tory networks. This will help curb zoonotic diseases.

The Centre said the pro-ject, in partnership with the Asian Development Bank (ADB), the World Bank and the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), would be imple-(FAO), would be implemented with the fund to be utilised by August 2026. Mr. Singh said the fund supported the existing initiatives of his department through enhancing disease surveillance, including genomic and environmental surveillance for early



and expand animal health laboratories. An

warning, laboratory infrastructure development, and cross-border collabora-tion, and would create a more integrated system for monitoring and managing "zoonotic" diseases.

Alka Upadhyaya, Secre-tary of the Ministry, said the fund was designed to bolster animal health sebolster animal health se-curity and the initiative for pandemic preparedness and response marked a sig-nificant step towards build-ing a resilient framework to safeguard the country. Union Animal Husban dry Commissioner Abhjit Mitra said the country was

at high risk of emerging infections as per the infec-tious diseases index. "In-dia scored low (42.8) on the Global Health Security Index with a high level of public health vulnerabili-ties. Sixty per cent of path-ogens that cause human diseases come from dom-estic animals or wildlife, man pathogens are of ani-man pathogens are of ani-mal origin," he said. Cli-mate change was intensifying the risks and frequency of zoonotic dis-ease in India, he said, cir-ing the example of diseases. public health vulnerabili

The project hopes to strengthen insti-tutional capacity at both national and regional le-vels by supporting the de-velopment of a disaster management framework for the livestock sector.

\$25-mn pandemic fund goes to curb 'zoonotic' diseases

The Union government has launched a project to improve animal health security in a partnership with the Asian Development Bank, World Bank and Food and Agriculture Organization

he Centre has started work on the \$25-million G-20 pandemic fund project to improve animal health in India as part of an effort to improve the preparedness and response to pandemics.

Union Animal Husbandry Minister Rajiv Ranjan Singh launched the project on Friday. It is designed to enhance the country's "animal health security" by upgrading and expanding animal health laboratories and developing laboratory networks. This will help curb zoonotic diseases.

The Centre said the project, in partnership with the Asian Development Bank (ADB), the World Bank and the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), would be implemented with the fund to be utilised by August 2026. Mr. Singh said the fund supported the existing initiatives of his department through enhancing disease surveillance, including genomic and environmental surveillance for early

warning, laboratory infrastructure development, and cross-border collaboration, and would create a more integrated system for monitoring and managing "zoonotic" diseases.

Alka Upadhyaya, Secretary of the Ministry, said the fund was designed to bolster animal health security and the initiative for pandemic preparedness and response marked a significant step towards building a resilient framework to safeguard the country.

Union Animal Husbandry Commissioner Abhijit Mitra said the country was

at high risk of emerging infections as per the infectious diseases index. "India scored low (42.8) on the Global Health Security Index with a high level of environmental risks and public health vulnerabilities. Sixty per cent of pathogens that cause human diseases come from domestic animals or wildlife, and 75% of emerging human pathogens are of animal origin," he said. Climate change intensifying the risks and frequency of zoonotic disease in India, he said, citing the example of diseases

borne by the mosquito vectors *Aedes aegypti* and *Aedes albopictus*.

"This pandemic fund project addressing human health through the lens of animal health would reduce the risk posed by a pathogen emerging from animal (domesticated or wildlife) and transmitting to the human population endangering their health, nutrition security, and livelihoods of vulnerable population (small-holding farmers, especially women)," Mr. Mitra said.

The fund is aimed at developing human capacitybuilding initiatives to enhance the skills and capabilities of animal health human resources. It will also be used to upgrade data management systems, and enhancing analytics capabilities will enable better risk assessment, improved decision-making and more effective communication strategies related to animal health risks. The project hopes to strengthen institutional capacity at both national and regional levels by supporting the development of a disaster management framework for the livestock sector.

• . Introduction of the Project



India's Nature Conservation Index rank 176, govt. slammed

NEW DELHI

The Congress on Sunday took a swipe at the BJP government over India reportedly being ranked 176 out of 180 countries on the Nature Conservation Index. Adding, "Should the bona fides of Israel's Ben Gurion University that codeveloped the index be also questioned."

There was no immediate reaction from the government on the reported ranking.

Congress general secretary in-charge communications Jairam Ramesh said, "Whenever India gets a very low rank on some global index or the other, the immediate response of the non-biological PM's drumbeaters and cheerleaders is to attack the index itself as a plot to defame India by agenda-driven busybody NGOs." But what will be

"This Index has been co-developed by Israel's Ben Gurion University. Will the bona fides of this university too be questioned?" Mr. Ramesh said.

India has scored low in the Global Nature Conservation Index, ranking 176 out of 180 countries. It is placed just above Kiribati which ranked 180, Turkey (179), Iraq (178) and Micronesia (177), according to reports.

- A New Conservation Benchmark
- Launched in October 2024, the Nature Conservation Index serves as a comprehensive tool for measuring conservation performance across countries.
- The NCI was developed by the Goldman Sonnenfeldt School of Sustainability and Climate Change at Ben-Gurion University of the Negev in collaboration with BioDB.com, a non-profit organization that maintains global biodiversity data.

 The index evaluates nations based on four key indicators: land management, biodiversity threats, capacity and governance, and future conservation trends.

- India's low ranking is largely attributed to rising biodiversity threats and inadequate land management practices.
- The nation has experienced a significant rate of land conversion, with 53% of its land repurposed for urban, industrial, or agricultural development.
- This extensive land use transformation has heightened the need for sustainable land management techniques.
- The index also flagged excessive fertilizer usage, with a sustainable nitrogen index of 0.77, warning of increasing soil pollution that threatens long-term soil health

- Marine conservation efforts also fell short, with only 0.2% of India's waterways under protection and none within its Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ).
- While 7.5% of India's terrestrial land is designated as protected, the index emphasized that greater action is needed to safeguard marine ecosystems.

Analysts including Decker Eveleth at the Virginiabased think tank CNA, Joe Truzman at the Washington-based Foundation for Defense of Democracies, and former United Nations weapon inspector David Albright, as well as other open-source experts, first identified the damage to the bases. The locations of the two bases correspond to videos showing Iranian air defence systems firing in the vicinity early on Saturday.

At Parchin, Albright's Institute for Science and International Security identified the destroyed building against a mountainside as "Taleghan 2." It said an archive of Iranian nuclear data earlier seized by Israel identified the building as housing "a smaller, elongated high explosive cham-

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"Such tests may have included high explosives compressing a core of natural uranium, simulating the initiation of a nuclear explosive," a 2018 report by the institute says.

In a message posted on the social platform X early on Sunday, the institute added: "It is not certain whether Iran used uranium at 'Taleghan 2,' but it is possible it studied the compression of natural uranium hemispheres, which would explain its hasty and secretive renovation efforts following the IAEA's request to access Parchin in 2011."

Modi, Sanchez to unveil first pvt facility for military aircraft today

PM and his Spanish counterpart to hold bilateral talks

SPAIN'S PRIME MINISTER Pedro Sanchez is reaching Vadodara on Monday where he and Prime Minister Narendra Modi will hold bilateral talks and inaugurate the Final Assembly

Line (FAL) plant of the C295 medium-lift tactical transport aircraft for the Indian Air Force. The Vadodara facility is India's first private military

Ine vadodara facility is India's first private military transport aircraft production plant, a partnership between Tata Advanced System Limited (TASL) and Airbus Defence and Space (Airbus DS).

Under the first 'Make in India' aerospace programme in the private sector, India is to acquire 56 C295 aircraft to replace the IAF's legacy Avro fleet.

Airbus is to deliver the first 16 aircraft in fly-away' condition from its FAL in Seville, Spain. The remaining 40 air-



Of the 56 C295 aircraft being acquired for the IAF, 16 will be delivered from Spain. Of these, six have already arrived

craft will be manufactured and assembled by TASL at the Vadodara facility.

With a proven capability of operating from short or unprepared airstrips, the C295, sources said, is used for tactical transport of up to 71 troops or 50 paratroopers, and for logistic operations to locations that are not accessible to current heavier aircraft.

It can airdrop paratroopers

and loads, and can be used for casualty or medical evacuation (medevac), as demonstrated during the Covid-19 crisis, using either basic litters or mobile intensive care units (ICU) with life support equipment. The aircraft can perform special missions as well as disaster response and maritime patrol duties.

Sources said the ministry of defence and Airbus signed a

\$2.5 billion contract for the supply of 56 C295. The first of 16 aircraft was delivered to the IAF from Spain in September 2023—so far 6 aircraft have been delivered.

The FAL plant in Vadodara, sources said, will roll out the first Made-in-India C295 aircraft in 2026. The 56th aircraft is expected to be delivered to the IAF by 2031.

The first Make-in-India pro-

ject in aerospace in the private sector involves the full development of a complete industrial ecosystem: from manufacture to assembly, test and qualification, to delivery and maintenance of the complete lifecycle of the aircraft.

Apart from the Tatas, leading defence public sector units such as Bharat Electronics Ltd and Bharat Dynamics Ltd as well as private MSMEs will contribute to this programme, sources said.

At present, the only final assembly line for the C295 aircraft is located in Seville – it also produces the Airbus A400 aircraft. This is the first time Airbus will have a full production system in another country.

Spain's Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez, accompanied by his spouse Begona Gomez, will be on an official visit to India from October 28 to 30.

He will hold bilateral talks with Modi at the Laxmi Vilas Palace. This will be his first visit to India—the first by a Spanish PM after 18 years.

Modi and Sanchez have met several times on the sidelines of multilateral meetings.

- **English**: Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez will inaugurate India's first private facility for manufacturing military transport aircraft, the C295, in Vadodara, Gujarat. The plant is a collaboration between Tata Advanced Systems Limited (TASL) and Airbus Defence and Space.

• . Significance of C295 Aircraft

- **English**: The C295 aircraft, which has a capability to carry 71 troops or 50 paratroopers, will replace the Indian Air Force's legacy Avro fleet. It is designed for tactical transport, logistics, and medevac operations, suitable for both short and unprepared airstrips.

Details of the Contract

- **English**: Airbus is set to supply 56 C295 aircraft under a \$2.5 billion contract. The first 16 units will be delivered from Spain, with the remaining 40 to be manufactured in Vadodara. The full delivery is expected by 2031.

- Strategic Importance of the Project
- **English**: This project, under the 'Make in India' initiative, is the first full production line for the C295 outside Spain. It signifies India's advancement in the aerospace sector and promotes a comprehensive industrial ecosystem involving private and public sector entities.

Bilateral Engagements

- **English**: Apart from inaugurating the facility, PM Modi and PM Sanchez will hold bilateral talks to strengthen defense and aerospace cooperation between India and Spain. This visit marks Sanchez's first official trip to India since taking office.


Minimum Diet Diversity Failure (MDDF) in Indian States

- The report was published in the National Medical Journal of India published by All India Institute of Medical Sciences.
- Minimum diet diversity
- Minimum dietary diversity is a reliable and widely used indicator approved by the World Health Organization (WHO) that reflects the access and consumption of diverse food groups and essential micronutrient availability to the children.
- As per the WHO, nutrition-related factors lead to approximately 35 percent of child deaths and contribute to 11 per cent of the total disease burden globally.

Key Findings of recent report

- **Data sources**: Scientists used National Family and Health Survey (NFHS) datasets from rounds 3, 4 and 5 to examine MDDF among children longitudinally, regionally and across population groups having diverse background characteristics.
 - The NFHS surveys, under the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, provided representative data covering India. The MDDF rate declined from 87.4% in NFHS-3 (2005-06) to 77.1% in NFHS-5 (2019-21).

• **Prevalence of MDDF:** Despite a decline, eight Indian states, mainly in the north, central, and west, still have over 80% MDDF among children aged 6-23 months.



- Uttar Pradesh (86.1%), Rajasthan (85.1%), Gujarat (84%), Maharashtra (81.9%), and Madhya Pradesh (81.6%) are the highest.
- **Regional Trends**: Central India had the highest MDDF (84.6%) as of 2019-21. Only 95 of the 707 districts analyzed showed MDDF prevalence below 60%, mainly in the south, east, northeast, and north.

- **Diet Diversity**: Consumption of food items within eight groups, including eggs, Vitamin A-rich foods, vegetables, and flesh foods, increased from NFHS-3 to NFHS-5.
- Factors Affecting MDDF: Logistic modeling found higher MDDF among children of young, illiterate mothers, girls, poor households, anemic children, low birth-weight infants, and those lacking regular health checkups at anganwadis/ICDS centers.

- **Historic Architecture and Natural Sites Protection:** UNESCO has assisted **137 nations** in protecting historic, cultural, and natural sites.In order to protect cultural assets, cultural diversity, and exceptional natural and cultural places, it has negotiated international accords.
- More than a thousand of these locations have been named World Heritage
 Sites due to their remarkable universal importance

- Environment Protection: Climate change is a global problem that demands a global solution. The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), which brings together 2,000 leading climate change scientists, issues comprehensive scientific assessments every 5-6 years.
- Initiative on Human Rights: UN General Assembly adopted the Universal Declaration of Human Rights in 1948.

Commitment to Reducing Inequality Index

• The Index is published by international non-governmental organisation Oxfam and Development Finance International (DFI), measuring **164** countries' commitment to reducing inequality.

About

 The fifth edition of the index ranked countries on their policies regarding public services spending (education, health and social protection), progressive taxation, and labour rights and wages.

- The top performers: These are all high-income countries, led by Norway, Canada, Australia, Germany and Finland.
 - Labour policies: These countries start from much lower wage inequality.
 - They have high social spending and collect more tax revenue.
- Belarus, Costa Rica and South Africa are at the best-performing among the low- and middle-income countries.

• The worst performers: They are lowand lower middle-income countries, all situated in sub-Saharan Africa (South Sudan, Nigeria, Zimbabwe, Uganda, Central African Republic, Liberia, Sierra Leone and Burundi).

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


SPICE 2000 Bomb

World's 1st Global Ecosystem Atlas



 World's 1st global ecosystem atlas is unveiled at the 16th Conference of Parties (COP16) to the United Nations Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD).

About

 The tool, developed by the Group on Earth Observations (GEO), is the first of its kind to focus on mapping and monitoring ecosystems around the world.

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The Atlas combines existing national ecosystem maps and fills in gaps using advanced techniques, such as Earth observation, artificial intelligence and field data collections.

It is **open-source**, it would be freely accessible to all.

• It provides important information about the **health and risks facing various ecosystems**, which can help governments, businesses, financial institutions and local communities make better decisions for sustainable management.

The Mukaab: World's Largest Building



• Saudi Arabia has officially commenced construction of the Mukaab — if completed, it is set to become the world's largest structure.

About

• Located in the capital city of Riyadh, this **400m cube-shaped building** will encompass a staggering two million square metres of floor space, equivalent to twenty times that of New York's iconic **Empire State Building**.

• The 'Mukaab' is part of the ambitious 'New Murabba' project, which aims to revitalise downtown Riyadh and contribute significantly to the Kingdom's Vision 2030 initiative. • The Mukaab will be built using the modern Najdi architectural style, one of the most prevalent architectural patterns in Saudi Arabia.

Najdi architectural style combines three main factors:

the need to respond to the hot desert climate,

the need for privacy in residential buildings, and

the need to use locally available materials such as mud brick stone and wood.

New Disability Certificate Rules

- Recently, the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment of India introduced the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (Amendment) Rules, 2024.
- Changes in Certification Process: Authority Requirement:
- Only a designated medical authority at the district level can issue disability certificates.

Colour-Coded UDID Cards: Color-coded Unique Disability Identity (UDID) cards—white, yellow, and blue—were introduced to indicate disability levels. Blue represents a disability level of 80% or higher.

Online-Only Applications: New norms make it mandatory to apply for the disability certificate online.

The issuance period for disability certificates has been extended from one month to three months.

Reapplication
Requirement: If no action is taken on a disability certificate application within two years, the applicant must reapply.
