






India and Japan sign agreement for UNICORN masts for naval warships

NEW DELHI

India and Japan signed a Memorandum of Implementation (MoI) for the "co-development" of UN-ICORN (Unified Complex Radio Antenna) mast, a conical structure that houses antennas atop warships increasing their stealth characteristics, for fitment on Indian naval warships under the framework of the India-Japan Defence Technology Cooperation.

Once implemented, this would be the first export case of defence technology from Japan under the bilateral agreement on defence equipment and technology transfer signed in 2015.

The joint statement issued after the 2+2 inter-Ministerial dialogue in August

2024 had referred to discussions over the "early transfer" of UNICORN and related technologies.

The MoI was signed and exchanged on Friday between the Indian Envoy to Japan Sibi George and Ishikawa Takeshi, Commissioner of Acquisition Technology and Logistics Agency under Japanese MoD at a ceremony in Tokyo.

Communication system

The UNICORN is a mast with integrated communication systems which will help improve the stealth characteristics of naval platforms.

"The Indian Navy is pursuing the induction of these advanced systems which will be co-developed by Bharat Electronics Limited in India with Japanese collaboration," the Navy said in a statement. When implemented, this would be the first case of co-development and co-production of defence equipment between India and Japan, it added.

Japan has been looking to export military hardware to some countries in recent years but has strict conditions given its pacifist constitution. India and Japan has earlier negotiated the procurement of amphibious planes for the Indian Navy over several years but the deal never made progress given the high cost and other priority procurements for the Navy.



Two men to face trial in U.S. for helping Indians to cross border

Harshkumar Patel, 29, and Steve Shand, 50, will each face four counts related to

Mr. Modi left on Saturday for a three-nation visit that will begin at Nigeria which will be followed by his visit to Brazil, and Guyana where he will attend the second leadership summit between India and the Caribbean nations grouping CARICOM.

"At the invitation of President Bola Ahmed Tinubu, this will be my first visit to Nigeria, which is our close partner in the West African region. My visit will be an opportunity to build upon our Strategic Partnership that is based on shared belief in democracy and pluralism," Mr. Modi

said in a statement. Mr. Modi's official engagements in Nigerian capital Abuja will take place on Sunday when he will receive a ceremonial welcome and hold delegation level talks with the Nigerian side led by Mr. Tinubu.

Nigerian media has reported that the two sides are expected to sign MoUs on critical sectors. From Nigeria, Mr. Modi will leave for Brazil, where he will be part of the G-20 summit. India hosted the G-20 summit last year.

"Last year, India's successful Presidency elevated the G-20 to a 'people's G-20' and mainstreamed the priorities of the Global South into its Agenda. This year, Brazil has built upon India's legacy," Mr. Modi said. The Brazilian G-20 summit will be one of the last international interac-

tions that U.S. President Joe Biden will attend during the remainder of his tenure which will end in January 2025. The summit is expected to draw other international leaders though Russian President Vladimir Putin, who had skipped last year's summit in New Delhi, is unlikely to reach Rio de Janeiro this year as well.

The last part of the visit will take Mr. Modi to Guyana where he will be hosted by President Mohamed Irfaan Ali.

"We will exchange views on giving strategic direction to our unique relationship, which is based on shared heritage, culture and values," Mr. Modi said. He will also interact with the Indian diaspora in Guyana which was one of the earliest diaspora in the western hemisphere.







Hypersonic weapons are manoeuvrable weapons that can fly at speeds of at least Mach 5, five times the speed of sound. They travel within the atmosphere and can perform manoeuvres midway which combined with their high speeds makes their detection and interception extremely difficult.

This means that radars and air defences cannot detect them till they are very close and get little time to react.
