



The blast took place at 10:40 a.m. in a building containing low-tempera-ture plastic explosives, according to a statement from the ordnance factory. These high-energy explo-sives are used in the am-



The building caught fire and collapsed, trapping 13 workers under the debris. The death toll rose during the day as the rescue oper-ation continued till around 8:30 p.m. National Disaster the trapped workers from the debris using special-

Four victims identified Only four of the deceased workers have been identified so far - Chandrashekhar Goswami (599, Mano) Meshram (555, Ajay Nag-deve (51), and Ankit Barai (20). Wanjari (55), Sanjay Raut (51), Rajesh Badwaik (33), Sunil Kumar Yadav (24) and Jaydeep Banerjee (42) — have been admitted to Laksh Hospital and the Bhandara District General Hospital and industrial safety team were at the spot. 

building what may become the world's biggest data centre by capacity in India, the latest in a blitz of global investments to capitalise on booming demand for artificial intelligence services.

RIL is buying Nvidia's powerful AI semiconductors and setting up a data centre in the town of Jamnagar that is expected to have a total capacity of three gigawatts, according

to people familiar with the matter, who asked not to be identified because the details aren't public. That would make it far bigger than any data centre now operating.

RIL CMD Mukesh Ambani is joining a growing cohort of tech companies including Microsoft, Alphabet and Amazon.com that are pouring billions of dollars into data centres to deliver AI capabilities to customers worldwide. This week, OpenAI, SoftBank Group and Oracle pledged to invest \$100 billion to \$500 billion in AI infrastructure in the US through a new entity called Stargate Project.



Tatas buy 60% in Pegatron's India unit for iPhone plant

Tata Electronics Emerges As Major Apple Supplier Like Foxconn

Mumbai: Tata Electronics has acquired a 60% stake in Taiwanese contract manufacturer Pegatron's India unit that operates an iPhone plant in Tamil Nadu. This follows Tatas' earlier acquisition of Wistron's India operations in Karnataka in March 2024.

The financial details of the stake acquisition remain undisclosed. This transaction positions Tata Electronics as a major Apple supplier alongside Foxconn, another Taiwanese manufacturer.

On Jan 7, the Competition Commission of India said it has approved Tata Electronics' proposed purchase of a majority stake in Pegatron Technology India and its 100% arm TEL Components' proposed business transfer to the Indian unit. CCI further said TEL Components is establishing a greenfield facility for smartphone electronics manufacturing.

facility, which has a yearly capacity of five million iPhones and employs about 10,000 people. The facility exports electronic products to Apple's operations across North America, Asia and Europe, while serving the Indian market.

Tata Electronics and Pegatron Technology India will collaborate to merge their teams, according to a Friday statement from the Tata Sons-owned company. PTI will undergo rebranding to reflect its new ownership structure. Previously, the company renamed Wistron Infocomm Manufac-

turing (India) to Tata Electronics Systems Solutions.

The negotiations between Tata Group and Pegatron had extended over several quarters as the latter sought a local partner due to slim profit margins and workforce management challenges. Notably, Wistron, an early Apple supplier in India, had experienced worker unrest at its facility in late 2020, resulting in property damage and attacks on senior executives' offices.

New Delhi: Group holding company Tata Sons has sought approval from fair trade regulator CCI for acquiring another I 10% stake in DTH operator Tata Play from Singapore's sovereign wealth fund Temasek. Tata Sons owns a 60% stake in Tata Play. AGENCIES

and Oppo — to produce components, aiming to diversify beyond Apple and develop a business model similar to Foxconn's. Tata Group initiated its ventures into electronic and semiconductor manufacturing(under Tata Electronics), healthcare (Tata Medical & Diagnostics) and battery manufacturing (Agratas) during Covid, responding to pandemic-related disruptions in human lives and supply chains. The conglomerate views these new enterprises as crucial for its expansion and development.

Statehood Day for Manipur, Tripura, and Meghalaya



- The Prime Minister of India greeted Manipur, Tripura, and Meghalaya on their Statehood Day (21st January).
- What is the Historical Context Behind the Statehood Day?
- Merger of Manipur: Before 1947, Manipur was an independent princely state.
- The Maharaja, Bodhachandra Singh, signed the 'Instrument of Accession' with the Indian government, agreeing to merge with India while ensuring internal autonomy.
- Manipur held its first election based on universal adult franchise in 1948, becoming a constitutional monarchy.

- Merger of Tripura: Tripura, a princely state, merged with India in 1949, facilitated by Queen Kanchan Prabha Devi, who assumed regency after King Bir Bikram's death.
 - After merging with India, **Tripura became a Part 'C' State**. In 1956, it became a **Union Territory**, and later on 21st January 1972, Tripura became a full-fledged State under the **NEA-(R) Act, 1971**.

Meghalaya:

- Meghalaya's statehood journey began with demands for greater autonomy from Assam, particularly from the Khasi, Jaintia, and Garo Hills, who sought a separate state to preserve indigenous cultures, especially after Assam's attempt to impose Assamese as the medium of instruction.
- In 1969, the Assam Reorganization (Meghalaya)
 Act established Meghalaya an autonomous state within Assam.

REORGANISATION OF STATES IN INDIA


The States Reorganisation Commission set up in 1956 suggested the formation of 14 States and 6 UTs. At present, India comprises 28 states and 8 UTs.

States classified into 4 categories
- Part A, B, C and D (1st Schedule)

- o Part A Ruled by Governor with elected State Legislature
 - Andhra Pradesh (first state on linguistic lines) 1953
- o Part B Former Princely States
- o Part C Former Chief Commissioners' Provinces, some Princely states
- o Part D Andaman and Nicobar Islands

7th Constitutional Amendment (1956) -

- Distinction between Part-A and Part-B states done away
- Part-C states were abolished
- Made total no. of (erstwhile) states 14 and UTs 6

About

- The number of GI tags issued by the department till date stands at 605.
- The number of authorized users for GI tags increased from 365 to 29000 and the number of patents granted increased from 6000 to 100000, in the last 10 years.

What is a GI Tag?

- A geographical indication (GI) is a **sign used on products** that have a **specific geographical origin** and possess qualities or a reputation that are due to that origin.
- GIs are part of the intellectual property rights that come under the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property.
- Administration in India: GI registration is administered by the Geographical Indications of Goods (Registration and Protection) Act of 1999.





Products: Agricultural products, foodstuffs, wine and spirit drinks, handicrafts, and industrial products.



Validity: For a period of 10 years, it can be renewed from time to time for a further period of 10 years each.



Related Facts: The first GI tag in the country was given two decades ago to the famous **Darjeeling tea.**

Uttar Pradesh retains its position as the state with the most GI-tagged products in India, reaching a total of 75.

Tamil Nadu follows behind with 58 GI products.

Memecoins

- What is a Memecoin?

Kashmir Chinars



- The Jammu and Kashmir government has launched a "Digital Tree Aadhaar" program to conserve the iconic Chinar trees.
- About Kashmir Chinars (Platanus orientalis)
- The **Kashmir Chinar (Platanus orientalis)**, native to Greece and Southern Europe, thrives throughout Kashmir, particularly in the **Eastern Himalayas**.
- It is famously associated with **Char Chinar**, an island on Dal Lake, Srinagar, named after the **four Chinar trees present there**.
- They can grow up to 30 meters tall, taking approximately 150 years to reach full height.

- Applications
- Medicinal Use: Various parts of the tree, such as bark and leaves, are used in traditional medicine.
- **Wood:** The wood is prized for making interior furniture due to its durability and aesthetic appeal.
- **Dye Production:** The tree is also utilized in the preparation of natural dyes.
- Cultural Significance: The Chinar tree is often considered a symbol of Kashmir, deeply rooted in its history, culture, and natural beauty.



- India has become the largest importer of tea from Kenya, with imports rising by 288%, from 3.53 million kg (January-October 2023) to 13.71 million kg during the same period in 2024.
- India's Tea Industry: Present Status
- Global Ranking: India is the second-largest tea producer after China, contributing 21% of global tea production.

• Exports:

- India is the **fourth-largest exporter**, with a **12% global export share**.
- India's tea exports also increased from 184.46 million kg from January to October in 2023 to 209.14 million kg during the same phase in 2024.
- Top export destinations include the UAE, Russia, Iran, U.S., and U.K..



Domestic Market:

Regional Production:

- Assam produces 55% of India's tea, making it the largest teaproducing state.






