
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

"Seventy-five years into our Republic, we cannot be seen to be so shaky on our fundamentals that a mere recital of a poem, or art or entertainment, such as stand-up comedy, can be alleged to lead to animosity or hatred amongst different communities. Subscribing to such a view would stifle all legitimate expressions of view in the public domain, which is so fundamental to a free society," a Bench of Justices A.S. Oka and Ujjal Bhuyan wrote in its verdict.

Why is Myanmar Frequently Rocked by Earthquakes?

• A powerful earthquake of magnitude 7.7 and at least six aftershocks struck central Myanmar.

About

- It was the strongest earthquake globally in the last 2 years.
 - It was a **shallow earthquake**, with a depth of only 10 km.
 - The **epicenter was located 17.2 km from Mandalay,** a metropolis with a population of around 1.5 million people.

- Affected Areas: Thailand (Bangkok),
 - Northeast India tremors felt, no reported casualties or significant damage.
- Tectonic Plates Involved: Indian Plate (west) and Eurasian Plate (east).
- Cause of Earthquake: Tectonic plates slipping past one another, releasing stored-up energy as seismic waves.

- The Myanmar earthquake took place due to the "strike slip faulting" between the Indian and Eurasian plates, meaning these two plates rubbed sideways against each other.
- Myanmar experiences frequent earthquakes, especially along the Sagaing Fault.
 - It runs north to south through the centre of Myanmar, and is prone to earthquakes.
 - Since 1900, at least six quakes of magnitude greater than 7 have occurred near the Sagaing Fault.

• Previous Significant Earthquakes in Myanmar:

- **1839:** Magnitude 8.3, estimated 300-400 deaths.
- **1990:** Magnitude 7, 32 buildings collapsed.
- **1912:** Magnitude 7.9, near the recent epicenter.
- **2016:** Magnitude 6.9.

• India has launched **Operation Brahma**, sending humanitarian aid and relief supplies to the affected region.

Assam Police search arrested reporter's residence twice

The Assam Police searched the residence of The Assam Police searched the residence of arrested digital media reporter Dilwar Hussain Mozumder in Guwahati's Ghoramara area twice within three hours on Friday morning. The search preceded a call by the Gauhati Press Club urging all members of the print, electronic, and digital media to wear black badges for three days leading to a meeting on Sunday to discuss the issue of journalists' safety. The protest was against Mr. Mozumder's rearrest on Thursday for allegedly trying to steal bank documents. On Tuesday, he was accused of criminal intimidation and abusing a member of the Scheduled Tribe.



Restaurants can't enforce service charge: Delhi HC

The Delhi High Court on Friday ruled that service charge or tips is a voluntary payment by the customer, and it cannot be made compulsory or mandatory by hotels and restaurants.

The court ruled that "the mandatory collection of service charge is contrary to law and violates the guidelines".

It also said that if consumers wish to pay any voluntary tip for services that they had enjoyed, the same would obviously not be barred.

The court rejected the plea by associations of hotel and restaurant owners such as National Restaurant Association of India (NRAI) and Federation of Hotel and Restaurant Associations challenging the Central Consumer Protection Authority's (CCPA) July 2022 guidelines prohibiting hotels and restaurants from automatically levying 'service charge' over and above the cost of the food items.

The CCPA had been receiving several complaints regarding restaurants and hotels collecting 'service Mandatory collection of service charge is contrary to law and violates guidelines, rules HC

'Follow guidelines'

On July 4, 2022, the CCPA, under the Consumer Affairs Ministry, issued guidelines stating that hotels or restaurants cannot add service charge automatically or by default in the food bill. "No collection of service charge shall be done by any other name," it said.

The court, on Friday, ruled: "All restaurant establishments would have to adhere to the guidelines passed by the CCPA. If there is any violation, action is liable to be taken in accordance with law".



Key Highlights:

- The Delhi High Court ruled that service charges/tips are voluntary and cannot be made mandatory by hotels or restaurants.
- Making service charge compulsory violates consumer protection laws and guidelines.

Court Observations:

- Mandatory service charge is "contrary to law" and violates guidelines.
- Consumers can **voluntarily pay** for services they enjoyed.
- No consumer can be **denied service** for refusing to pay a service charge.

- These associations challenged the July 2022 guidelines issued by the Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA).



- Hotels/restaurants cannot auto-add service charges to food bills.
- No service charge can be collected under **any alternative name**.
- The range of 5–20% service charge (in lieu of tip/gratuity) must not be imposed compulsorily.



- **Strict action** will be taken under consumer laws if establishments violate these norms.
- Restaurants must follow CCPA guidelines strictly.

Army inducts in-house developed First Person View drones

NEW DELHI

The Indian Army has begun inducting a First Person View (FPV) drone with anti-tank payload that was developed, tested and validated in-house, in collaboration with the Terminal Ballistics Research Laboratory (TBRL), Chandigarh. Five of the FPV drones, each costing ₹1.4 lakh, have been inducted and 95 are being procured, officials said. The FPV drones came into prominence in the war in Ukraine and have changed the battlefield dynamics by disproportionally taking out heavy and expensive military platforms like tanks. It was developed by Maj Cephas Chetan with a team of TBRL, led by Dr. Ragh-

vendra under an initiative launched in August 2024.

About First Person View (FPV) Drones

- **Purpose:** Offers precise navigation and control, especially for tactical or combat missions, racing, surveillance, and reconnaissance.

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Modi likely to inaugurate Vande Bharat train to Srinagar on April 19

Maitri Porecha NEW DELHI

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will flag off the first Vande Bharat train to Kashmir in April, railway sources told *The Hindu* on Monday.

The Vande Bharat train journey from Katra to Srinagar will reduce the travel time to a mere three hours. "Currently the road route takes at least 6 to 7 hours," railway officials said.

Currently, railway services are operational between Barammulla-Srinagar to Sangaldan in the Kashmir valley. "Now that Sangaldan has been connected to Katra in Jammu via rail, trains can run between the whole stretch," officials said.

The inauguration, likely on April 19, will complete the 272-km Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Rail Link (USBRL) project.

The Kashmir version of Vande Bharat is equipped with climate-specific adaptations to provide advanced heating systems in sub-zero temperatures; the driver's front look-out glass is embedded with heating elements for defrosting and to ensure clear visibility during harsh winters.

While the ambitious project to connect Kashmir by train began in 1997, it was commissioned in bits and parts and faced multiple delays due to geographical challenges posed by the terrain of Himalayas.

In 2009, the Qazigund-Baramulla section in Kashmir was rendered operational, following which in 2013, the 18-km Banihal-Qazigund section, and in 2014, the 24-km Udhampur-Katra section was started. In 2023, the section between Banihal and Sangaldan was started, and now the connectivity between Sangaldan to Katra, which is believed to be the most difficult of all sections, has been completed.

The Vande Bharat train will snake through the Chenab Bridge standing 359 meters above mean sea level. Developed at an estimated cost of ₹37,000 crore, the Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Rail Link project involved laying out ballast less tracks over bridges and tunnels, spanning deep gorges, with 90% of the route traversed over 943 bridges, and 36 main tunnels, including India's longest railway tunnel, T-50 stretching more than 12.7 kms.

On the Katra-Banihal section the train will also traverse another engineering marvel, the Anji Khad bridge which is India's first cable stayed bridge.

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Why efficient air conditioners must be a national priority in India

Even with many new thermal and hydro plants under construction, India faces a projected shortfall in firm capacity as early as 2026—just one summer away; the most immediate and cost-effective solution lies in improving the energy efficiency of air conditioners in the market

s India braces for another intense П summer, the country's power grid is once again under strain. With temperatures soaring past 45°C in many regions, millions of households and businesses are switching on their air conditioners (ACs) for relief. But while ACs provide essential comfort and protection, they are fast becoming the single largest driver of peak electricity demand-especially during the evening and night time hours when solar generation fades but the heat lingers.

India is currently adding 10 to 15 million ACs each year, with another 150 million expected over the next decade. Our recent study shows that without urgent policy action, ACs alone could contribute as much as 120 gigawatts (GW) to peak electricity demand by 2030 and 180 GW by 2035. That would represent nearly one-third of India's projected evening peak-placing enormous stress on the grid, requiring expensive new investments in power generation and storage, and significantly increasing the risk of blackouts.

This trajectory would give manufacturers the long-term clarity needed to invest in advanced components, such as high-efficiency compressors, heat exchangers, and smart control systems. Without a predictable policy signal. manufacturers are hesitant to retool their supply chains and scale up production of energy-efficient models. But with a phased. transparent MEPS timeline, they can plan and invest with confidence.

Cost-effective strategy Tightening AC efficiency standards is one of the fas-

test, most cost-effective ways to reduce future electricity demand and strengthen India's power system. According to our study, a strengthened MEPS could reduce peak demand by 10 GW by 2028, 23 GW by 2030, and 60 GW by 2035– the equivalent of 120 large power plants. These reductions would help India avoid up to ₹7.5 trillion (about \$85 billion) in new power generation and grid

lief, upgrading efficiency standards doesn't always mean higher prices. In both Indian and global markets, past MEPS revisions have not led to price spikes. In fact, inflation-adjusted AC prices have continued to decline over time, driven by economies of scale, improved supply chains, and greater competition. Our study confirms that energy efficiency is not the primary driver of AC prices in India. Many efficient, no-frills models are now available at prices that are comparable to less efficient models.

Tightening MEPS is the most powerful way to transform the market quickly-shifting the entire baseline upward, lowering electricity demand, and ensuring that every new AC sold in India contributes to a more reliable and affordable grid. Raising AC standards is not just an energy efficiency measure-it's a power system reliability safeguard, a consumer savings strategy, and an industrial competitiveness lever all rolled into one.






Fig 1.4 : Estimated Reserves of Natural Gas in India as on 01.04.2024

SDG Progress & Challenges

- India has shown significant improvement in its Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) index 2024 ranking which has improved to 109th out of 166 countries.
- States have also demonstrated better performance, with an average increase of five units in the composite index over the past three years.

How Has India Performed on SDGs So Far?

- Overall Progress: India's SDG index score improved from 57 (2018) to 71 (2023-24).
- States Performance: Kerala & Uttarakhand lead with 8 goals each scoring above 80 (above 80 score is an indicator of achievement).
 - However, over 9 states recorded a decline in No Poverty (Goal 1), Gender Equality (Goal 5), Reduced Inequality (Goal 10), and Strong Institutions (Goal 16).


- Target Specific Progress: SDG-3: Maternal Mortality Ratio reduced from 130 (2014-16) to 97 (2018-20) per 1,00,000 live births.
- SDG-4: The Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) in higher education rose from 23.7% to 28.4% between 2014-15 and 2021-22.
- **SDG-6:** Over **95%** of people in **rural areas** and **97.2%** in **cities** are having access to improved sources of drinking (potable) water during 2020-2021.

- SDG-7: India's renewable energy capacity increased from 180.80 GW in December 2023 to 209.44 GW in December 2024.
- Budgetary Allocations: Some states (like Haryana, Odisha, Meghalaya) now publish SDG-specific budgets.
 - Developing nations need **USD 4 trillion annually** to meet SDGs.
