Wet bulb temperature is the lowest temperature to which a surface can be cooled by water to which a surface can be cooled by water evaporating from it, or the lowest temperature to which the surface of the skin can be cooled by sweating. Beyond this threshold, the human body can no longer cool itself, leading to heat stroke or even death. This temperature accounts for not only the degrees but also helps measure humidity and understand how much.

evaporation can occur.

This is particularly significant to India, which has a vast coastline in the east and west, and where rising humidity levels are of concern. Steven C. Sherwood et al in the paper 'An adaptability limit to climate change due to heat stress' point out that peak heat stress, quantified by the wet-bulb temperature, is surprisingly similar across diverse climates today. Exceeding a wet bulb temperature of 35°C for extended periods would induce hyperthermia in humans, as dissipation of heat becomes impossible.

It's not about signing something like an insurance policy. We're not entering into an

accession treaty. It's a negotiation of synergies. underlying Mr. Amorim said, adding that while China could give the relationship any name, for Brazil any partnership would involve projects defined and decided by Brazil. concern dependence

He did not, however, reject the BRI outright or forswear Chinese funding for a number of projects, mainly on infrastructure, but also in other areas, ranging from solar energy to hybrid such projects would engage not only Brazil but also other South American countries. Finally, Mr. Amorim pointed to more geopolitical collaborations that Brazil and China can further, such as the six-point peace plan for Ukraine.

Why is the timing important? Unlike most of its neighbours, Brazil is one of only four South American countries not to join the Chinese initiative. Mr. Lalla's predecessors Jair Bolsonaro and Michel Temer had been positive on Chinese investments but demurred at Beijing's multiple attempts at getting Brazil to sign an MoU on the BRI. As of December 2023, about 150 countries worldwide have done so, with India and Brazil being notable exceptions n the developing world, especially given their common membership of the BRICS. Russia also has some BRI projects under development for energy and roads, but it has not signed the MoU, only inking a China-Eurasian Economic Union In July, however, Mr. Lula had told a news



# Eye on moon voyage, Isro gets 1st analog space mission

New Delhi: The country's first analog space mission has taken off at Leh in Ladakh, where space agency Isro will simulate life in an interplanetary habitat as India is planning to send a human to the Moon in the near future.

Analog space missions are field tests in locations on Earth that have physical similarities to the extreme space environments and play a significant role in problem solving for spaceflight research. Ladakh has been chosen for such a mission as the geographical features of the area — dry and cold climate, barren land,

ered to closely resemble Martian and lunar landscapes, and are an ideal training ground for scientific missions aimed at exploring planets.

"A collaborative effort by Human Spaceflight Centre, IS-RO, AAKA Space Studio, Unitonomous Hill Development Council, this mission will simulate life in an interplanetary habitat to tackle the challenges of a base station beyond Earth," Isro wrote on X Friday.

The month-long mission, that kicked off mid-Oct, comes provide a base to launch interplanetary missions. The mission includes a compact, inflatable habitat named Hab-1, which is equipped with essentials like a hydroponics farm, kitchen, and sanitation facilities. It provides a self-sustaining environment, offering valuable data as India is planning long-duration space missions to Moon, Mars, and beyond.

Lying at an elevation over 3,000 metres, Ladakh has oxygen levels only 40% of those at sea level. The low-pressure, low-oxygen setting allows researchers to evaluate life support systems under conditions similar to those on Mars. The team of AAKA





## First 'black hole triple' System Discovered


 Astronomers have found a rare triple black hole system called V404 Cygni that changes our understanding of how black holes form.

 Located about 8,000 light-years from Earth, V404 Cygni has a black hole with two orbiting stars—one very close, circling every 6.5 days, and a second much farther away, around 100 times the distance of Pluto from our Sun.



- Insights from V404 Cygni
- This V404 Cygni system suggests a different formation method called "direct collapse," where a black hole forms quietly without a supernova explosion. Thousands of simulations confirmed that this was the most likely way V404 Cygni's black hole formed, sparing the second, distant star from being ejected by a violent explosion.



#### WHAT IS A BLACK HOLE? Black holes are mysterious and terrifying – and we've got a simple guide to how they work... A black hole is a region of space where absolutely nothing can escape. That's because they have extremely strong gravitational effects, which means once something goes into a black hole, it can't come back out. ■ They get their name because even light can't escape once it's been sucked in – which is why a black hole is completely dark. Most black holes are made when a supergiant star dies. This happens when stars run out of fuel – like hydrogen – to burn, causing the when this happens, gravity pulls the centre of the star inwards quickly, and collapses star to collapse. into a tiny ball. It expands and contracts until one final collapse, causing part of the star to collapse inward thanks to gravity, and the rest of the star to explode outwards. The remaining central ball is extremely dense, and if it's . especially dense, you get a black hole. We don't know for sure what happens when you enter a black hole. A popular theory is that objects become stretched out and lose all dimensional form, before disappearing completely. So don't try it.




