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
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

The results of the election declared on Saturday delivered a jolt to the AAP with party supremo Arvind Kejriwal and former Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia losing their seats. Atishi, who had taken over as Chief Minister from Mr. Kejriwal, managed to retain her Kalkaji seat.

The Congress failed to win a single seat for the third time in a row, with a majority of its candidates losing their deposit. While the BJP increased its tally from eight to 48, there was only a 2% difference in the vote share of the AAP and the BIP.

Celebrations erupted in BJP offices as trends showed that the party would sail past the majority mark of 36.

Why has private investment been sluggish?

Why has private investment been sluggish? Many economists have blamed the lack of sufficient consumer demand for the lack of strong private investment in the country. They argue that unless the government does something to increase the amount of money that consumers have in their hands to spend, investors would be unwhiling to take the risk of investing in business projects. Given this backdrop, making incomes up to ₹12 lakh tax-free is seen as an attempt to put more mo in the hands of individuals to boost consume spending and spur private investment. However, over the decades, there has been an inverse or negative relationship between private

negative relationship between private investment and consumer spending. Private final consumption expenditure stood at a high of 90% of GDP way back in 1950-SI, from where it dropped gradually over the decades to hit a low of 54.7% of GDP in 2010-II. At the same time, private investment as a At the same time, private investment as a percentage of GDP rose from around 10% in the decades between independence and economic liberalisation to around 27% in 2007-08. private investment hit a peak in 2011-12, private consumer spending has actually risen, not fallen. In other words, over the last decade or so, consumer spending has actually risen at the same time that private investment has dropped from its peak. This suggests that the negative relationship between private investment and relationship between private investment and consumer spending could simply be due to the fact that the money in an economy that is not invested is spent on consumption, and unfriendly government policies are cited as the major reasons behind the slowdown in private investment. Many analysts have pointed to the drop in the pace of economic reforms as discouraging private investment projects.

The second cause for concern of the Trump

administration's tariff plan is that it tacitly endorses the weaponisation of tariffs as a countermeasure against unrelated inter-cou disputes - in this case the inflow of unsanctioned migration and illegal drugs – rather than rely on traditional law enforcement activity to ensure less porous borders.





Seeking an eve for an eve

The death penalty is a quick-fix approach adopted by governments to quell anger

n February 7, the Cal-cutta High Court re-jected the West Bengal government's appea seeking the death penalty for the man convicted for the rape and murder case of a wo-man at the R.G. Kar Medical Hospital in Kolkata last year. However, the Court admitted a separate appeal, also de-manding the death penalty, by the Central Bureau of Investi-gation (CBI), which investigat-ed the case.



under Union Govt, control New Delhi, Feb. 9: The tobacco industry will be brought under the control of the Union Government and a cess will be levied on the entire production of virginia tobacco and on exports of all types of tobacco to finance the proposed tobacco board. Provisions to this effect are contained in the

Provisions to this effect are contained in the Tobacco Board Bill that has been introduced in the Lok Sabha at its last session. The Bill is expected to come up for consideration and adoption in the budget session. The board with its headquarters at Guntur will have 21 members including the Chairman. Barring the three MPs, who will be selected by

Barring the three MPs, who will be selected by the two Houses of Parliament, the other members will be appointed by the Union Government. They will include representatives of the Union Ministries dealing with agriculture, commerce, finance and industrial development, the Indian Council of Agricultural Research, Andha Pradesh and Kamataka Governments. Besides these, the Centre will appoint two members to represent the tobacco-growing States, other than Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka, by rotation in alphabetical order. There will also be eight members to represent tobacco growers, dealers, and exporters, manufacturers of tobacco products and experts

The Board will regulate production and virginia tobacco market, and ensure fair and remunerative price for the growers, develop new markets for Indian tobacco, recommend minimum export price for virginia tobacco, and make purchases from growers to give price support to growers



Chart 3: Top exporters of vehicles and related parts to the U.S.






Chart 4: Top exporters of nuclear machinery and mechanical appliances to the U.S.

Chart 5: Top exporters of mineral products to the U.S.




Chart 7: Top exporters of pharmaceutical products to the U.S.




Chart 10: Top exporters of precious stones and metals to the U.S.



Figures indicate country-wise share of major U.S. goods imports.






Chart 7: Top exporters of pharmaceutical products to the U.S.

Informing Accused Grounds of Arrest Constitutional Requirement

 The Supreme Court of India has ruled that informing an accused of the grounds of arrest is not a mere formality but a mandatory constitutional requirement.

Supreme court ruling

• The Court held that failing to inform the accused of the reasons for arrest amounts to a **violation of fundamental rights** enshrined under **Article 22, Part III** of the Constitution.

- The information must be conveyed in a manner that effectively communicates the grounds of arrest to the accused in a language they understand.
- The court also referred to Article 21 and said no person could be deprived of their liberty except in accordance with the legal procedure.

Constitutional Provisions

- Article 22(1) of the Indian Constitution states; No person who is arrested shall be detained in custody without being informed, as soon as possible, of the grounds for such arrest.
- 1. The arrested person shall not be denied the right to consult and be defended by a legal practitioner of their choice.



Significance

Burden of Proof on Law Enforcement: If an accused alleges a violation of Article 22(1), the police must prove compliance with the mandate.


Judicial Oversight: Judicial magistrates, when granting remand, are required to ascertain whether compliance with Article 22(1) and other legal safeguards has been met.

National Commission for Safai Karamcharis

- The Union Cabinet has approved the extension of the National Commission for Safai Karamcharis (NCSK) tenure until March 31, 2028, with a financial implication of around Rs 51 crore.
- About the National Commission for Safai Karamcharis (NCSK)
- It was established on 12th August 1994 under the National Commission for Safai Karamcharis Act, 1993, initially for a period of 3 years as a statutory body.

- The Act was extended until 2004, after which the Commission became a **non-statutory body** under the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment.
 - The Commission takes suo-motu notice of issues affecting Safai Karamcharis based on media reports or observations.
- Composition: The Commission consists of a Chairperson (Union Minister of State rank), a Vice-Chairperson (Secretary rank), five members (including one woman member), and a Secretary (Joint Secretary rank).

- Mandate of the Commission: Recommend programs for the elimination of inequalities for Safai Karamcharis (sanitation workers). Evaluate and study social and economic rehabilitation programs for Safai Karamcharis and scavengers.
- Monitor working conditions (health, safety, wages) of Safai Karamcharis employed by various employers, including government bodies.

Bill Proposing 100 days Parliamentary Sitting



Senior Opposition leaders in the Rajya Sabha have introduced Private Member Bills seeking to mandate a minimum of 100-120 parliamentary sittings per year to enhance legislative accountability and scrutiny.

About Proposed 100 Days Sitting in a Year:

Objective of the Proposal:

Seeks to ensure minimum working days (100-120 days) for Parliament to strengthen deliberative functions and improve governance accountability.

Inspired by the **General Purposes Committee (1955) and National Commission to Review the Working of the Constitution (NCRWC, 2002)**.

• Current Scenario of Parliamentary Sittings:

- No constitutional mandate for minimum sittings, only Article 85 and Article
 174 mandate that Parliament and state legislatures must meet at least twice a year.
- The 17th Lok Sabha (2019-2024) had the lowest full-term sitting (274 days) in Indian history.

United Kingdom (150-160 days), USA (133-140 days), Canada (130-140 days) have higher parliamentary sittings ensuring robust debates and scrutiny.

Legislative Powers with Respect to Sittings:

Article 85 & Article 174 of the Constitution

 Mandates that the gap between two sessions should not exceed six months, but does not specify a minimum number of sittings.



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


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
