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



While large firms are prepared to comply quickly with most of the Rules, Mr. Vaishnaw said that a maximum of two years are being given for implementation. This will allow certain categories of data fidu-



ciaries some more time to prepare for the full implementation of the Digital Personal Data Protection (DPDP) Act, 2023, which the Rules seek to operationalise. The government is currently accepting stakeholder comments on the draft until February 18.

"The law has been drafted in a way to ensure the functioning and autonomy of the Personal Data Protection Board of India," Mr. Vaishnaw said, adding that the implementation of the Act would be digital in nature. The same approach has been followed in at

least one other institution: the Grievance Appellate Committee, which deals with social media complaints under the IT Rules, 2021.

Promoting components

On electronics manufacturing, Mr. Vaishnaw said, "We are working on a programme for promoting and incentivising component manufacturing in our country", adding to existing schemes for IT hardware and semiconductors.

Chennai Metro Rail to provide roofing in elevated stations

Every time it rains, whether a heavy downpour or mild shower, rainwater spills over onto the platform, making it slippery for passengers. In a bid to address this issue, Chennai Metro Rail is taking up work to cover some of the areas in the stations across the Phase I and Phase I ex-

tension network.
The Metro Rail has an operational network of 54-km, which includes 20 ele-vated stations. In certain areas of the stations, such as the staticases, entry points, and platforms, pas-sengers are facing difficul-ty walking when it rains. Ragavan, a regular user of metro, said, "As such, platforms is quite slippery and the situation gets further exacerbated dur-ing rain. We have to walk carefully. So, if the authori-ties are providing roofing,



ICMR gets low-cost tech to detect iron deficiency

AnemiaPhone, a technology developed by Cornell University researchers to accurately, quickly, and cheaply assess iron deficiency, has been transferred to the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) for integration into its programmes for anaemia alleviation, women's health, and maternal and child health.

A release issued by Cornell University said that AnemiaPhone would enable access to rapid screening, and diagnosis of iron deficiency at the point of need.

Iron deficiency is a leading cause of anaemia, which affects 50% to 70% of pregnant women in India.

The technology requires a small finger stick, a drop of blood on a test strip similar to a COVID-19 home test, and a few minutes for the reader to assess. The information is uploaded to a clinical database via mobile phone, wireless tablet or computer. Healthcare workers can interpret the test and provide guidance, triage and referral, or intervention on the spot.

The Centre's share in States' revenue has surged in the last decade

The falling efficiency of States in collecting more taxes has deepened their dependency on the Centre

ver the last decade, States have been relying more and more on transfers and grants from the Centre. In the last decade (FY16 to FY25), 23-30% of the total revenue

of States was collected from the Centre as transfers. However, in the 2000s and the first half of 2010, the share was 20-24%. Also, close to 65-70% of the non-tax re-venue of States was collected from the Centre as grants in the last de cade compared to the 2000s and the first half of the 2010s when the share was lower at 55-65%.

share was lower at 55-65%. States have also not done enough to efficiently collect taxes to increase their own tax revenue. In addition, revenue from non-tax revenue, other than Central grants, has been diminishing. The combination of these factors has meant that the dependences in recent vears.

n in recent years.

Chart 1 shows the share o States' own tax revenue, non-tax revenue, and Central transfers in their total revenue. For over a decade now, States' own tax revenue as a share of their total revenue has remained considerably below the 50% mark, while in the 2000s and in the early 2010s, it had crossed the 50% mark for many years or remained close to it. Own tax revenue of States includes money raised through stamp duty, regis-tration fees, motor vehicle tax, and

tration fees, motor vehicle fax, and other taxes, along with the State component in Goods and Services Tax (GST), or State GST (SST).

While SGST accounted for 15% of While SGST accounted for 15% of the States' total revenue in FY18, it currently makes up about 22%. This is shown in Chart 2. Conse-quently, the share of own tax reve-nue, without the contribution from SGST, has declined from 34%

from SGST, has declined from 34% to 28%.
This means that not only is the share of States' own tax revenue consistently below the 50% mark, but also an increasing share of it is derived from SGST. It is important to note that the SGST is earned based on rates set by the GST Council and these rates have reouncil and these rates have remained a bone of contention. In the past, Finance Ministers of many Opposition-ruled States includ-ing Tamil Nadu, Kerala, and West Bengal have spoken out against the Council's decisions.

Chart 3 shows a detailed split or the share of grants from the the share of grants from the Centre, earnings from services, in-terest receipts, and dividends/pro-ins from State public sector enter-rowenue. Interest receipts have not exceeded 5% of non-tax revenues in the last decade compared to the 2000s and first half of 2010 when it formed 5-9% of non-tax revenue, and profits surnered from State and profits garnered from State public sector enterprises has re-mained under 1%.

Earnings from services ren-dered, such as public health (social service) and power (economic ser-vice), did not cross the 30% mark in the last decade. It is only esti-mated to cross the mark in FY2S. Compare this to the 2000s and first half of 2010 when it crossed the mark for many wear.

the mark for many years. While the share of interest re-ceipts and earnings from services has come down, the share of grants from the Centre has in-creased (65-70% in the last decade compared to 55-60% in the 15 years before that). This is shown in Chart 3.



particular.
For Tamil Nadu, the own tax re-venue to GSDP ratio has gradually declined from 7.72% in FYI3-15 to 6.17% in FY 22-24. 






Chart 3: A detailed split of States' non-tax revenue. (Figures in %)



While gold imports accounted for \$11.7 billion of the \$14.2 billion revision in the year's import bill, silver imports accounted for another billion as they were recalibrated to \$2.33 billion from \$3.28 billion estimated as of December 16. The data revision implies India's trade deficit this year should be about \$14 billion lower than esti-

mated earlier. November's trade gap remains the worst on record but at around \$31.8 billion, from the earlier estimate of \$37.84 billion.

October's import bill has also been revised downward, but by a marginal \$0.16 billion to \$66.18 billion, which means it still marks India's highest import bill in a month.

Ajai Srivastava, director of the Global Trade Research Initiative, said the government must explain the rationale behind the revision to ensure India's economic data retains credibility among investors and financial markets.







Greenland Will Bring Shipping, Mineral Heft

40% Distance shaved off the western Europeeast Asia route if ships were to go through the Arctic Sea instead of Suez Canal, the circuit that's currently preferred because Arctic waters tend to stay ice-bound for the better part of the year.



- ➤ However, global warming is thawing down the Arctic route and the forecast is for the traffic through the area to dramatically increase, especially as newer routes open up, like the North-West Passage (see map). It'll allow ships to avoid the Russian-controlled Northern Sea Route.
- ➤ 25/34 of critical raw materials Europe needs for its industries and the green transition can be found in Greenland. In 2023, EU signed an MoU with Greenland to develop sustainable raw materials value chains.
- ➤ Warming temperatures are making mining easier in Greenland, which has large deposits of rare earth metals key to the production of energy transition tech and batteries.


White settlers, of course, displaced American Indians as they captured and came to control the North American landmass but, through its history, US has employed many devices to expand its territory, from conquest to outright purchase. Here's a selective list:

To bring foreign territories under its sway, US could draw up a Compact of Free Association (COFA) – which allows a foreign country to maintain a high degree of economic integration with the US while remaining politically independent. US has COFAs with three Pacific Island states –

Micronesia, Marshall Islands, and Palau.

Since the 19th century, US has come to control 16 'insular areas', jurisdictions associated with it that are nonetheless not part of the country. The most recent — Northern Mariana Islands — was added in 1986.



Greenland Could Soon Be Independent

Greenland is an autonomous territory of Denmark and the island of 55,000 people is heavily dependent on the Scandinavian country for its economy, defence and foreign policy. But there is an ongoing movement in Greenland for complete independence. The next Greenlandic parliamentary election is scheduled for 2025 and could signal which way the independence movement goes.

Section 479 of BNSS, 2023

The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has issued directives to all states and Union Territories (UTs) for implementing Section 479 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS) 2023.

About Section 479 of BNSS, 2023:

<u>Purpose</u>: Provides relief to undertrial prisoners by mandating their release on bail or bond under certain conditions.

Key Provisions:

- Subsection (1):
 - Under trail prisoners (UTPs) who have served **half the maximum sentence** prescribed for the offense (except those punishable by death or life imprisonment) shall be released on bail.
 - For first-time offenders, UTPs serving one-third of the maximum sentence are eligible for release on bond.

Subsection (3):

 Makes it mandatory for prison superintendents to file applications in the concerned court for the release of eligible prisoners.

Superintendent of Jail Responsibility:

 Ensure timely application for bail or bond to the court for eligible prisoners.
